Dear Marcia,

The Family Federation is composed of all sorts of people. God and True Parents do not limit who can become a member and therefore we have a great diversity in character, personality, and in the spirituality of our membership. The goal of True Father is ultimately to help every individual reach the standard where he/she can relate to God directly -- and build in within and around them the Kingdom of God. With that said, there are many things that happen in our movement at all levels of membership that may be questionable. If we bring our faith to be dependant on these things we will never grow. Our spirit will get stuck in the bureaucratic and politics and ultimately will die.

The most important mistake made by religious individuals, not just in our movement, but in every religious movement, is the limitation they put on their faith. Their faith is dependant on their pastor, their teacher, their central figure. If that pastor, teacher, or central figure says or does something that does not make sense or even contrary to the teachings, then in the end that individual can lose faith and lose the ability to connect to God.

What kind of church are we?</p> <p>We are a movement who is restoring the world. We are a movement which is fighting on a daily basis with 6,000 years of misconception, misunderstanding and ignorance of what is true. Many things will come and go; many traditions will come and go during this restoration process. At the end of this history what will remain is an ideal relationship between God and humankind and the creation, nothing else of the 6,000 years struggles will be there. Is the "spiritual membership" story true or not? I do not know. If I come across an explanation for it, I will let you know. What is important however is that it is irrelevant to my relationship with God and with True Parents and with the Divine Principle.

There is no reason why you should not go to a matching.&nbsp; However,you will have to be clear about your situation with the proper blessing staff.&nbsp; I think it will help if you can take with you a simple medical explanation from a medical expert of the disease and its consequences, and what could be expected to happen in the future.&nbsp; That should make the staff more confident in handling your case.

You have to consider the possibility that you may be matched to someone who will also carry the same or similar disease. I have never been part of the blessing department so I do not know how they will handle it.&nbsp; Just be forthright and confident about yourself.&nbsp; If the first time around no match can be found for you do not give up; just be patient.

If you need additional guidance let me know. You seem to have the mind to handle this situation correctly and I do not feel through your mail that you are overburdened by it.&nbsp; You are taking the situation responsibly.

I would like to ask you about my 36 month old son. He is so adorable, cute and very smart but sometimes he makes me spank him a little. I hate to do that because at the end of the day I feel so guilty about it but also, I don't want him to get hurt or hurt his little sister who is only 9 months old.

</p> <p>Sometimes he act very rude toward his sister, or when we go to the grocery store, he will run and sing loudly or play around and people have to stop their strollers to avoid hurting him. I feel so embarrassed by that. My husband has no patience with him when he acts badly.

</p> <p>I fight with my husband all the time because of that. I love my kids so much that since they were born I did not work; I do not want to take them to a babysitter. I decided to stay home and take care of them but now I am scared that our son will grow to be violent and full of anger toward others.

</p> <p>Would you please give us some advice?</p>

Hello Dear,

It looks to me that your son is desperate for attention, and he will go to extremes in behavior to get it ... even if it means a spanking or getting a negative response from his dad.&nbsp;Raising one child is not an easy task for anyone and requires great patience, but raising more than one, requires more than just great patience and love, it requires skills that most of us do not have by the time we reach the age of parenthood. If the Fall had not occurred these skills will have been passed down from generation to generation.&nbsp;Then in the Ideal World of today there would also likely be plenty of great family and community support to help raise high-spirited strong children.

Special note: In order o eliminate some physical health issues with your child, one thing you will have to do -- if you have not done it yet -- is to speak to your pediatrician. Your pediatrician should help clear up or eliminate any health related issues, and also he or she could direct you to a professional counselor (if needed) to help you with your child's behavior.

First things first; in order for you to solve the problem with your son, you must solve the problem between you and your husband. Both of you need to make a plan on how to raise your children. Raising children is team work, not just one parent over the other. You are both upset with your son's behavior, both frustrated because you do not know how to handle his young personality, and it would be natural if you both felt inadequate to the task.

I would suggest that you two take time with each other to reset your goals on how to raise your family. Take into consideration your finances, your social activities, and religious commitments. All play a part on the guidelines that you are setting for your children. The ultimate goal is for your children to become better people than yourselves and continue in the path that you started when you became a follower of our True Parents.

Your struggle is not unique, it is multiplied by millions in the fallen world and also it is found in many of our own blessed families. Do not put yourselves in a weak position by beating yourselves up, just look up to the finish line and know that you will get there as long as you do it together with God at the center of your being a family.

Now for practical points of advice:

Get your hands on good books that relate to your family problems, and read them. The following link:

http://www.blessedfamilies.org/bfa/index.php?p=parenting will list several professional counselors and also some books. I have not read </p>
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them but I would expect, since there are listed on our Blessing Family Department web site, that they are good materials. Do not ever fight in front of your children. If you do not agree with one another about anything -- anything at all, wait until you are alone together to argue about it. Even though you may feel the need for spanking, it should be done extremely sparingly, and lightly, just as a reminder to the child that you are in charge and not him or her. Done too frequently and it will lose its power of persuasion and could work to your disadvantage if the child senses this may be the only way to get the attention he seeks. As a side note: Spanking is often a release mechanism for the parent but it sometimes does not do anything more for the child than possibly accumulating resentment. Your son deserves your love and attention and it should be given to him in adequate amount. Just make sure you do it. Sometimes it is easy to forget, especially when you have a 9 month old who is asking for the same thing. Your son should have personal time with you and your husband, without the little sister around. Even though you do not like to use a babysitter, you may want to do it once a month -- or even more often than that -- and take your son to the movie or MacDonald's or a pizza, and all by himself without his sister tagging along. If all else fails, I believe that both of you need to see a good, professional, family counselor. There is no shame whatsoever in doing so and there is too much at risk to not do whatever it may take to set things straight. Remember, you are not just raising a family, you are restoring one. That is all for now, please keep me posted if you wish. Take care, both of you, Anne-Marie

By the way, my personal approach to saying "no" is not the word "no" but the words: "Yes, but..." Religions in the past have portrayed the act of marriage as a necessary but evil thing, not to be talked about and better to be done in the dark. True Father has spoken about the act of marriage with much more honesty, passion, and I will add ... even reverence. There is absolutely nothing to be ashamed of in performing the act of marriage with God's blessing. That is, to me, the first point for the general population to understand.

Then we must help them understand why it must be done only after certain conditions are met. To explain that I would use a twofold approach. One, I will explain what would have happened to Adam and Eve if they had been able to withstand the temptation and go directly to God for advice. Second, because of the fall, the process of being permitted to fulfill the act of love now requires the blessing of the Messiah. That is the difference between before the fall and after the fall.

There is no one on this earth, except for our True Father who can explain with such clarity the consequences of the fall. That understanding cannot be absorbed with just a couple of lectures but hopefully enough can be understood to gain the patience necessary to wait and first seek a deeper understanding of God and his Principles.

Love is a powerful force and should remain so. The act of marriage is only a small percent of what that force is. If we, as individual, are able to comprehend what absolute Love is, abstinence before marriage with God's blessing is possible.

LETTER TO:&nbsp;BFD Representatives and BFD National Ministry Coordinators

Clarification about matching Second Generation to First Generation.

There has been some confusion about whether Second Generation can be matched to First Generation. Father did it himself a couple years ago in a special case of older BC girls who did not have any prospects of finding a match. With their permission, Father matched them to pure Jacob Children.

Because of a misunderstanding, several high level leaders announced that Second Generation could now be matched to First Generation. That is NOT correct. Only Father can do it and only under very special circumstances.

Unfortunately, we are still trying to correct many misunderstandings by members who heard those mistaken announcements. In addition to that, the book that my wife and I have been promoting by Dr. Yoshiko Masuda with many of Father's words about Husband-wife relationships also contains this error. In Vol. 2 (green one), on page 10, this misunderstanding is repeated. The book exists only in Japanese and all Japanese members in <st1:country-region w:st="on"><st1:place w:st="on">Japan</st1:place></st1:country-region> were told of the correction.

However, many Japanese members in <st1:country-region w:st="on"><st1:place w:st="on">America</st1:place></st1:country-region> who are reading this book probably did not hear about the correction. They need to be told and I would like to request your help in spreading this announcement among your Japanese members.

Below are two clarifications. One is from the author of the book, Dr. Masuda. A second explanation is from Rev. Phillip Schanker.

To the best of my knowledge Father has, on 2 or perhaps 3 occasions, made a special matching between 1st and 2nd Gen. partners. All of them were unique and providential, as in the one case I know about: when TF invited representatives of the Korean STF to Yeosu for a day of fishing, etc., a Japanese brother was lost in a boating accident. Thinking the brother had drowned, all were surprised to find him hours later in the air-filled hull of the capsized boat, waiting for rescue. TF was relieved and inspired, and declared the event a meaningful providential occurrence. He matched this brother during the celebration and his talk. One was 2nd gen, the other 1st. Also prior to the Dec. 29, 2005 "Gyocho" Blessing, TF mentioned that if no match could be found for any older 2nd Gen candidate, TF would consider matching them to 1st gen., if they were willing. In this case it seems he was concerned to make sure that all 2nd gen. would have a match. He made no such couple this time, but one can imagine that this situation will arise again as 2nd Gen get older.

It is clear that in each case like this, TF was exercising his authority for some special reason. I am not aware that he has extended that authority to allow anyone else to match 1st and 2nd Gen. He clearly encourages Blessed Children to contribute what they have to offer to the renewal of God's lineage, preferring pure 2nd gen. be matched to pure 2nd gen. rather than to 1st Gen or Fallen 2nd Gen. </P></p> <p><P class=MsoNormal style="MARGIN: 0in 0in 0pt"><?xml:namespace prefix = o ns =</p>

 <P class=MsoNormal style="MARGIN: 0in 0in 0pt">For Fallen 2nd gen. who have restored their faith, TF prefers they be matched with the same category rather than EITHER pure 2nd gen. OR 1st gen.

Some parents, more concerned with the happiness and desire of their children than with lineage issues, have allowed or approved a 1st - 2nd gen. match & Blessing between their children who may love each other and request it. I am not aware whether or not approval from TP has been sought or granted in any of these cases. I know most have been without permission, and doubt that any have been allowed. Certainly, one day the barrier between 1st and 2nd Generation may be eliminated, as well as between 2nd and 3rd, 3rd and 4th, etc. I don't believe that day has come yet.

Certainly many 2nd Gen. cannot comprehend or relate to the value of their pure lineage, or how important it is to TP for the restoration of True Love & God's sovereignty. When a 2nd gen falls in love with and marries a first gen. outside the Blessing, they lose their position as 2nd gen. I assume that when 1st & 2nd gen couples were matched by TF (2 or 3 cases, as I said) they are lifted to the position of 2nd Gen. by God's grace & TP's authority, but I am not sure. Certainly most 2nd gen would not want to be matched by TF to 1st Gen. if it meant losing their precious and important position, nor is it likely that TF would do such a thing. There have been some 2nd gen. matched with a 1st gen. with their parents approval only, and allowed to participate in the Blessing, though the idea is strongly discouraged by some BFD's & leaders, and not allowed by many others. In these cases, the couple must accept that their position is First Gen and that they must go the restoration course of First Gen (i.e. Holy Wine, Indemnity Stick Ceremony, Blessing, 40-Day Separation, and 3-Day Ceremony). Also their children will walk the course of 2nd Gen. not 3rd Gen.

I hope this understanding is helpful. As you pray about these things please remember and value the precious seed of your children's pure lineage, and of all the sacrifices of 6000 years, from Abel -to-Jesus-to-True Parents that it took to realize it. It is a profound and serious consideration whether to "spill that seed" for any reason.

White men should "run, not walk" to wed "racially conscious" white women and avoid being out-bred by non-whites. Latinos are "rising to take this country away from those who made it...[the] Euroamericans." Muslims are "human hyenas" who "smell blood" and are "closing in" on their "weakened prey," meaning "the white race." Blacks, are "saintly victims who can do no wrong." Black solidarity and non-white immigration are imposing "racial revolution and decomposition" in America. The whole of human history as "the struggle of ... races." Non-white immigration is "importing poverty and revolution" that will end in "the eventual loss of sovereign American territory." Muslims In England "are turning life in this once pleasant land into a misery for its native inhabitants."

</p> <p>According to the SPLC, the Washington Times has published articles taken from white supremacist hate groups, anti-Semitic ads for a book called "For Fear of the Jews," and an ad from a key Holocaust denial group.>
