July 1st: Make our way back to Guatemala City and traveling to visit black sand beaches and ruins

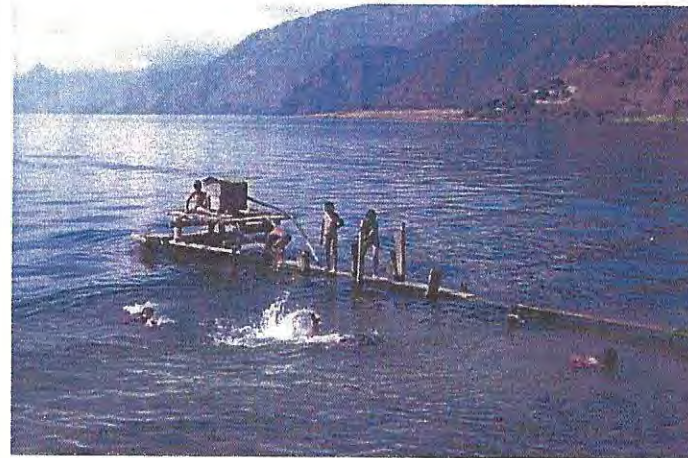
July 2nd: Return to Guatemala City and depart back to SFO

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What: Project Serve: Giving to Guatemala is a two week service project in the form of direct outreach to the people of Guatemala. Our focus of service is educating students in 25 schools around the rural areas of Guatemala on the fundamentals of dental hygiene such as how to brush and floss their teeth. The topic is simple but needed in the community and relationships are built based on the mentors, our participants of Giving to Guatemala, developing a deeper connection and understanding of the culture and lifestyle of the people in Guatemala.

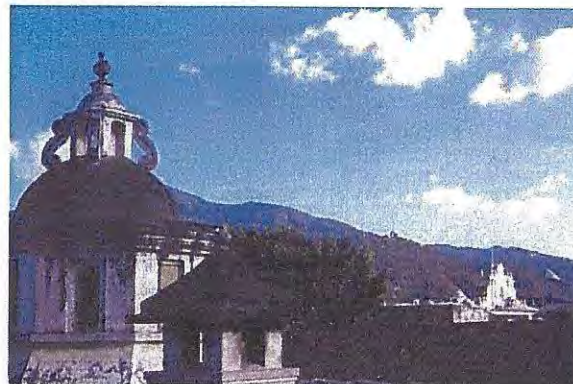


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Where: We will be arriving in Guatemala City and travel to where the majority of service activities will take place in Santiago Atitlán. Here is where we will also be residing. We will plan to have a cultural visit to Antigua as well as visit Tecpan to see the Mayan Ruins. Towards the end of the day we will stop by Panajachele for a fun day traveling across the lake.



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How: A youth group of 30 high school and college-aged students have volunteered to travel to Guatemala for two weeks this coming summer. Airfare to and from Guatemala City, lodging, food and ground transportation have all been arranged at the cost of \$1,000 per participant. With our group size this leads to total costs for the summer to be approximately \$30,000. Our 30 participants and staff have committed themselves for this project in the summer and collectively earn the total budget.



We currently need to receive 5,000 toothbrushes and tubes of toothpaste as a donation to our project which we will give away to the students we instruct on dental hygiene health. Our volunteers who have dedicated themselves to this project are working hard to raise the necessary money needed from donors like you to make this trip possible! We need your help to turn this vision into reality! We are very grateful for financial support that brings us closer to our goal to help hundreds of Guatemalans this summer!
