On August 8, 1987, then World CARP President, Hyo Jin Moon led a demonstration of 2000 CARP members protesting the Berlin Wall and communism. The Wall represents the divide of people never envisioned by our Heavenly Parent, God, he declared. He continued to explain that the pain and misery brought on by communism is not God's design, but the love of God can absorb even our enemies.

Korea and how that leads into world peace.



Representatives from each country had opportunities to share about their own growth in their life of faith and their youth activities dedicated to reunification of the Korean peninsula.

"The main point that stood out to me was the fact that we can overcome anything centering on Heavenly Parent's love. Although we may have nothing to offer, when we determine in our hearts to live for others centering on Heaven, we can move forward and bring reunification."

A new CARP house near the University of Maryland opened on August 20th!



CARP Bay Area discuss the meaning of life in summer retreat


