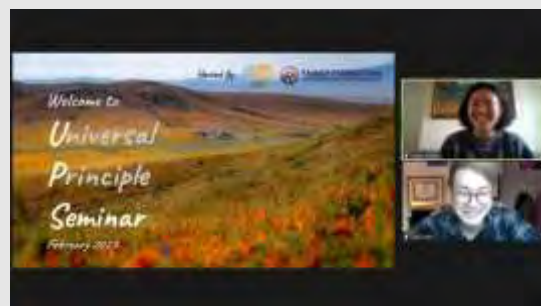
CARP DMV holds first 2 day seminar of the semester

On February 26 to 27, CARP Las Vegas also held their first two-day retreat of the semester. The theme was, "What is God's Plan for You?"

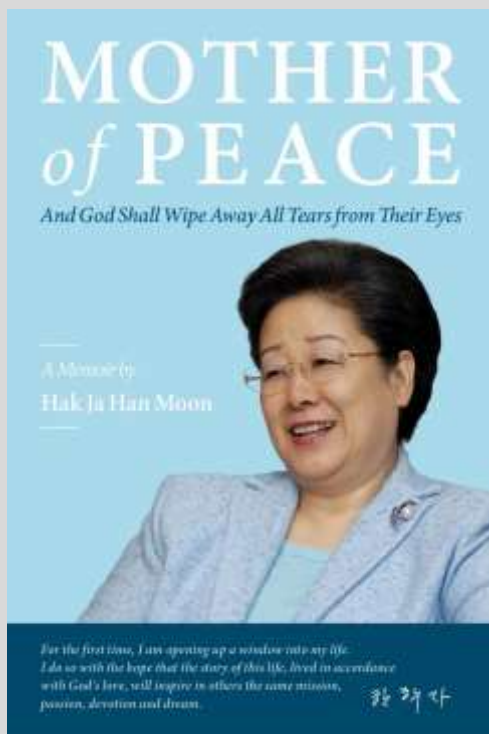
