On November 26th, the mayor organized a senior's dinner and about 233 people came. It was a wonderful opportunity to witness and get to know better the people living in the same village. It is just the beginning. We have many projects on the way, such as to visit all the seniors to assess their needs, celebrate their birthdays, etc. The mayor gave us a list of all of the seniors, more than 1600 in all. Many of these people have a lot of experience in life and have held important positions in society. They have a great deal of wisdom to offer and we have a lot to learn from them.
