SPOT THE SIGNS - stop the abuse



Domestic Violence occurs across all social and ethnic groups and takes many forms.

Victims are much more likely to confide in someone close to them.

Be aware of someone who:

- Had stopped socialising
- Is worried about upsetting a partner
- Has little control over money
- Has shown signs of physical harm
- Is constantly being checked up on
- Asks you not to "tell"
- Has low self-esteem
- Has animals in the home who have been harmed
- Has children who appear nervous/withdrawn.

1 in 4 women, 1 in 6 men are victims.
