Mutsuko "Julie" Moore, a beloved mother of three and sister to the NYC community, was admitted to the hospital after a serious asthma attack in December. After suffering from irreparable brain damage caused by the attack, the family made the decision to let her free and to move on in peace. Mutsuko passed away peacefully on January 2nd, 2022, at 62 years old. She leaves behind her husband Mark Moore, her three children Nina Moore, Lisa Moore, and Matthew Moore, and Bitzi the cat.

Mutsuko Moore was born June 12, 1959, in the Hyogo prefecture of Japan. She grew up in the countryside with her two older brothers, mother, father, and grandmother. In her youth she enjoyed cooking with her grandma, playing volleyball, and walking through nature. When her mother passed at a young age, her stepmother raised her. She joined the Unification Church as an adult and came to the United States, meeting people all over the country and expanding her life of faith through fundraising. She then married at Madison Square Garden in 1989 and had three children in New York City.
