Through online and offline voting, it has been decided that the funds will be divided among three endeavors: emergency medical aid funds for the Multicultural Families Organization, volunteer aid for teen heads of household and senior citizens who live alone, and support for Ireun Doongi (Premature Infant), a group that supports premature infants.
