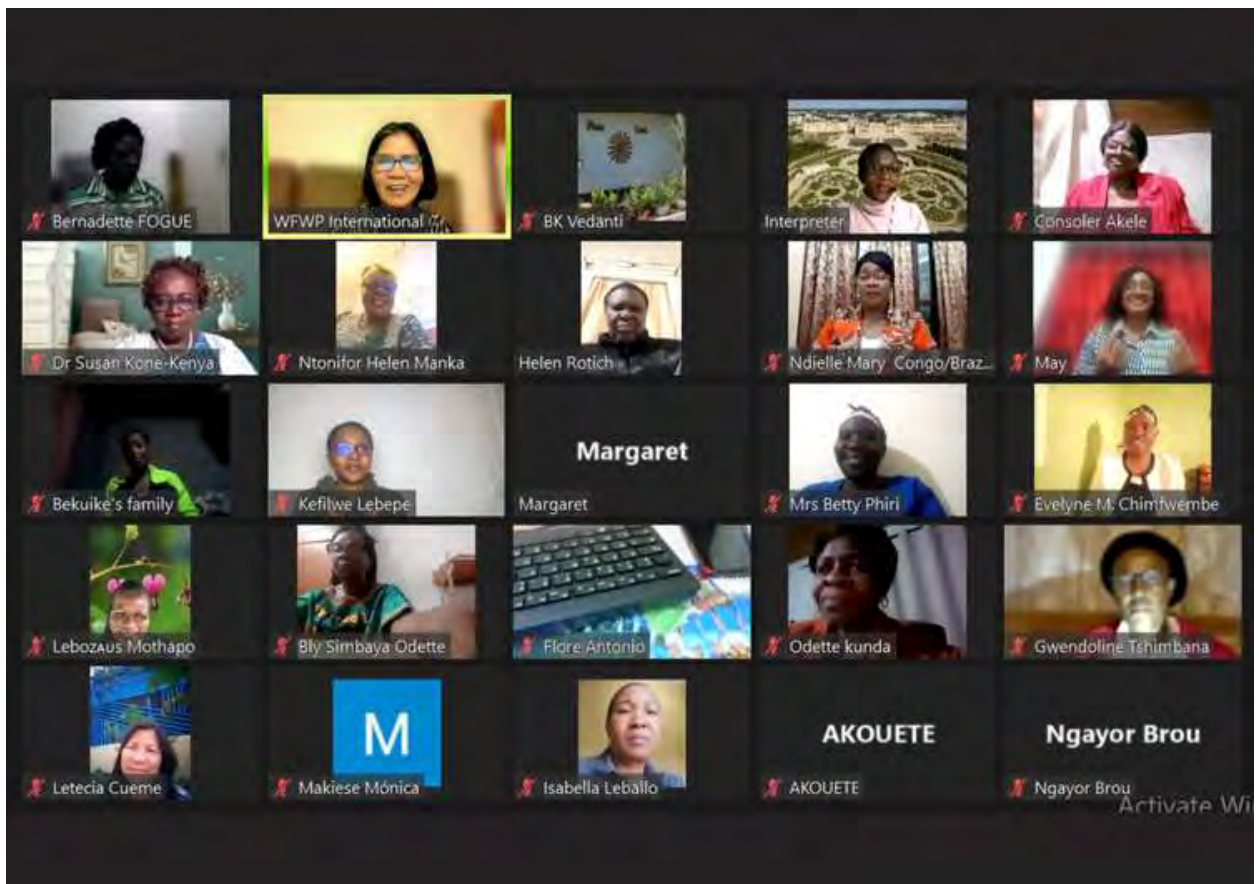


# WFP Africa celebrated International Day of Families By Nurturing Inner Peace

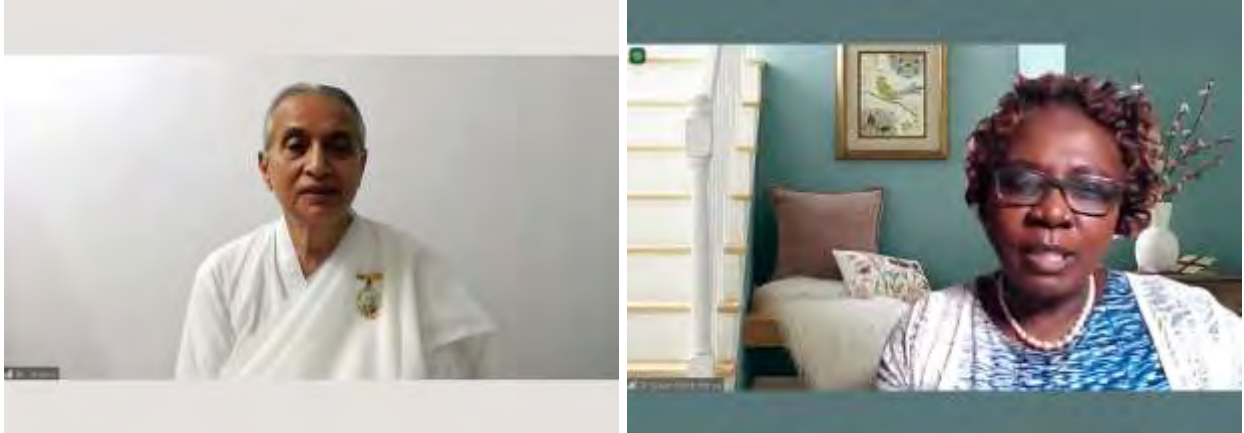
