Back in Australia we set up a team to raise funds to make the 'Island Lights Project' a reality. Our first annual walk-a-thon was held this year in Victoria and New South Wales. Through the Victorian walk-a-thon we were able to purchase \$4,000 worth of high quality portable solar lights.



The lights were sent to Vanuatu via Brisbane and received by Jong who Deug Yoo, oversees the WFWP Vanuatu Chapter. Rev. Yoo then travelled to Tanna Island to deliver the solar lights to the women of the villages. The port and transportation cost within Vanuatu was \$246 and were delivered on July 13th.



Lamnatu is home to 340 people within 40 households 15 and The family groups. women's leader of the village is Joyce Daniel. Joyce expressed WFWP gratitude to Australia for the donation. Each mother received lights for their family use.
