For many years she has provided inspiring leadership in addressing the crisis of violence experienced by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families. She is a distinguished teacher and researcher in the restoration of people's emotional health and social well-being. Pearl's mother Marjorie was a descendant of the Stolen Generation with Aboriginal, Filipino, Japanese and Irish heritage, whilst her father, Nicholas, had both Aboriginal and Scottish ancestry. Born at Old Mapoon Presbyterian Mission in North Queensland, she grew up on Thursday Island in the Torres Strait and has worked in a variety of capacities in the healing and teaching of others. She holds a Masters degree in Health Science (Primary Health Care), a Diploma in Primary Teaching, and soon to graduate with a Diploma of Theology

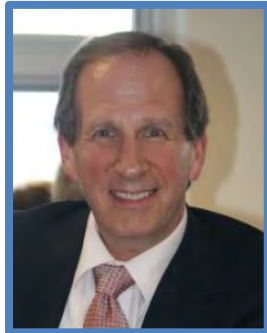

Voice to Parliament: What if the Yes and No sides got together to find a way forward?

The *common-enemy identity* politics tries to unite a coalition using the psychology of *us versus them* which leads to a mindset that life is a battle between good people and evil people. A *common-humanity identity* seeks to find common ground based on shared values.

The long-term benefits of the Voice in Parliament cannot be achieved through political processes alone but must involve a commitment to truth, shared values, and personal change.

Dr John Bellavance has a PhD in values education from Monash University, focusing on moral psychology and the use of technology. John is an Information Technology educator, writer, and public speaker. He is also the Oceania Coordinator, International Association of Academicians for Peace, and National Vice- President of UPF Australia.
