Moon, as the new chairman, said, "We will expand the projects that the volunteer organization Aewon was currently supporting," according to the Korean online news agency, Newsis.

Aewon was founded by Rev. Sun Myung Moon and Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, founders of FFWPU, in 1994 in order to realize their vision of true love. This organization has served the underprivileged for 20 years. Aewon has developed cultural welfare projects such as "Dream Seed Lesson," "Dream Seed Concert" and "Performance Delivery Service." As part of the "Dream Seed Lesson" the volunteers teach music, art and play to underprivileged or handicapped children. Then, those children take part in a "Dream Seed Concert." Volunteers with "Performance Delivery Service." stage performances on location for people who live in the countryside or are handicapped. The Aewon organization also hosts North Korean art exhibitions and sends books to North Korea. Its volunteers help out in local soup kitchens and assist the elderly.

At the event, Mr. Myung Jin Ko, a participant of "Dream Seed Lesson" was able to develop his dream and gave a special performance, according to Newsis.
