The first ever outdoor rally with President Hyun Jin Moon was held in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia on July 9th. 'Are you ready for a whirlwind?' he asked. Yes, we were ready, and the whirlwind hit everyone!

About 12,000 people gathered at the Park Stadium. More than half had already been in touch with *Service for Peace* and came attracted by its vision. However, the first-timers quickly caught on, and by the time Hyun Jin Nim took the stage, everyone was cheering his name. When he asked if they truly were the owners of SFP, the reply 'Yes' came in strong unison.

In the weeks up to the rally, all

details of preparation were smoothly guided by Hyun Jin Nim's confidence that this rally would succeed.

The main project in the build-up for the rally involved the venue itself. The Park Stadium was build 34 years ago and had nearly fallen apart but Service for Peace volunteers from various schools and organizations worked for several weeks to restore it. By July 9 th the old stadium had become the SFP stadium, restored for safe use and painted in SFP blue with dandelion logos on the main walls.

Finally, the day before the event, a Member of Parliament, a city district chief, a school director and other social leaders worked side by side with Hyun Jin Nim and Jun Sook Nim amidst a hundred high school pupils. The project was co-organized by the Capital City's Children and Youth Development Department, whose director and staff took a very active role in organizing the rally. Other sponsors included the YFWP of Mongolia, a Mongolian student union and even the city's two TV stations.

The program began with famous Mongolian national culture group *Tumen Eh* offering a concert for all participants of the rally. Next the Tong Il Moo Do Martial Art group put on their awesome demonstration, followed by songs from students from the Cultural University of Mongolia. The music sounding through the stadium and most of downtown Ulaanbaatar inspired many young people to attend the rally right up to the last moment. All seats of stadium filled up and the number of participants went far beyond the ten thousand which had been planned before.

After the national anthem, Ms. Tsogzolmaa the head of Youth and Childrens Development in Ulaanbaatar, and Mr. Enkhbold the City Governor gave heartfelt messages representing local government offices and NGOs cooperating with us. Mr. Thomas Phillips introduced about the international work of Service for Peace and Mr. Ganbat explained about local activities in Mongolia.

Mongolia Can Lead the World

Finally the time came that over ten thousand young people were waiting for, and our honored guest Pres. Hyun Jin Moon took the stage, welcomed in the traditional way with a blue ribbon and milk. He told the young Mongolian people that they held the keys to their nation's future. If every person could invest his or her heart and soul for the sake of others, our country can once again influence the world this time by our moral ethics. But if every person lives for their own benefit then this or any nation will surely be destroyed.

After his speech, Mr. Davaanyam, President of *Chinggis Khaans Academy* granted title of 'Honored Academician of the Chinggis Khaanas Academy' to Hyun Jin Nim. It was a mark of great respect from the Mongolian people.

The third part of rally started with young people's songs call-







ing people to serve. Then Mongolian popular pop group *Nomin Talst*, children from the National Children's Palace and popular rock group *AXE-6* all offered their concert. Finally Hyun Jin Nim brought the whole stadium to its feet through his bright and infectious Rock'n Roll!

President's Page: Flying on The Wind of History

Extracts from a speech delivered in World CARP Japan Headquarters

The first question I always ask members is, 'How much do you believe?' How determined are you to create a new revolution? Are you willing to even give up your life? This is something you should not say lightly.

The last time I was here in Japan, I said that World CARP has to be the vanguard of our movement; the front line crack troops. Are you really like that? If you are, then you have to be better than average, you have to have a greater level of conviction and dedication, because the hopes of all those who follow you reside in you!

The way to liberation, and the course and formula for liberation is 'Living for the Sake of Others.' What happens if you only live for sake of yourself? That way leads to ultimate destruction! Why do people take drugs? Why do people engage in destructive behavior? The root cause of that is self-pity that comes from thinking of myself!

The culture and tradition of God

From the beginning the culture and tradition of God has been the way of sacrificial true love. That is why I am teaching about living for the sake of others and have created the *Service for Peace* movement. I expect all of you to become the seed and embodiment of this new culture that is rooted in the original ideal of God. All World CARP members should live based on this paradigm, even if we have to make sacrifices over and over again!

Ten years ago Father predicted that this new millennium would see the emergence of a new spiritual culture that valued service and sacrifice. He said that the pursuit of material and secular riches would quickly become secondary.

We have now entered into that very time. Do you think that it is just a chance that George Bush, President of the United States, said in his State of Union speech earlier this year that serving others is the only way for peace? This is all in God's plan. The world is waiting for a new peace initiative.

The wind of history is behind us. All we have to do is to spread the wings so our movement can rise. But in order to spread our wings, we have to have conviction and belief that the promise will come true and the kingdom will be built. This is what I mean by ownership! That conviction must be ours.

What we should do now

At this time we shouldn't be consumed with our own petty ambition and concerns. We must be filled with the ambition of heaven; so we can be instruments by which God's original expectation can be realized! That has to be the aspiration of every CARP leader and member!

Will you do it? If you have that kind of conviction then you will see amazing things happening in your family, on your campus and in the nation. The

first one you have to move is yourself. If you do not believe it, how can you lead others?

The true leader is someone who has the greatest conviction and belief. Even if the members are weak he is able to give strength, conviction and power. If you can do that, do then you will naturally inherit la eadership position; you will naturally be the leader of men and women!

Even if we are weak physically if we have that type of conviction we can fill the shoes of 10,000 men because God has infinite power!

Service for Peace is based on three root principles. The first is that humanity is one family, the next that we are in essence spiritual beings; and lastly that selfless service fosters personal growth and peaceful individuals, families and communities. In this way, service is applied as an educational vehicle to bring about a transformation in the human heart, human relationships, and human culture, thereby facilitating peace.

Though the project is centered at Washington DC, some of the volunteers reached out to the neighboring states, too, like Maryland and Virginia.

More than 50 kinds of services are being rendered such as: picking up the trash and cleaning up the streets, parks, creeks and churches, as well as arranging books in the library; paintings; squeegeeing of stores and establishments; gardening; mentoring; tutoring; singing; manning a soup kitchens; visiting shelters; taking care of elderly people; yard sale; shed building; singing, and etc.

The program is expected to conclude in late July with a joint project with the DC Public Schools to kick off 'Schools Readiness Month,' painting and gardening , erasing graffiti and generally making the District's schools ready for the new school year in September.

Doing Good and Having Fun

The participants working hard, but they are definitely enjoying themselves too. 'Amazing! I developed myself and I did what I would love to do!' said Yemi Pickard, 18, a singer and artist. Shin Nan Goto, 19, agreed 'The SFP Summer of Service allows kids of any race, religion, or culture to follow their consciences, and just live for other people.' the University of Virginia freshman said, 'We want to focus on how much we can give and not on how much we can receive.'

'This is a great opportunity to change the world quickly!' enthused F. C., 21, from Paris, France. The culmination of SFP Summer of Service 2002 will be the rally of 10,000 young people at MCI Center on July 26.

26th UTS Graduation Heralds Bright Future

Three years ago, the Unification Theological Seminary stood at the edge of the abyss, with a declining student body and drastically reduced financial means. To many, it seemed that the school would not survive to see the new millennium, but June 22 saw the commencement of the 26th graduating class on schedule and on track.

Although the graduating class of 24 was the smallest so far the natural result of the crisis three years ago - this year saw several firsts, including the graduation of the first Christian student from outside the Unification Tradition, Christian Tekwe from the Cameroon. Another student, Rev. Dong Woo Kim from New York, was the first of the alumni to upgrade from the Master of Religious Education degree to the more demanding Master of Divinity degree after several years a church bishop in New York.

At a board meeting just before the commencement exercises, the seminary's third president, Tyler Hendricks, reported to the trustees that enrollment at the school had grown for the last five semesters straight and that it now stood near a historical high. UTS is working on a number of new initiatives, including a leadership development program in conjunction with World CARP, which may push the number even higher in years to come.

'We'd like to invite all our alumni back to UTS,' said

Hendricks, 'especially those who graduated only with a certificate from the early days when we were not accredited.' It is now possible and relatively easy for former students to upgrade their qualifications on completion of a modest amount of course work.

Chairman of the Board, Mr. Farley Jones, said that much of the credit for the turnaround must go to Hendricks who was President of the Unification Church in North America for several years before taking up his post in the spring of 2000. Working with his core staff, Hendricks had made sweeping changes and cutbacks as the seminary struggled to live within its much diminished means. Jones entreated the new board members, including this writer and Rev. Don Olson of the Lutheran dialog center in Miami to play an aggressive role in developing the school.

to help ministers from other Christian churches get a theological and practical education.

In busy streets of Manhattan, the challenges facing belief in God come thick and fast, no more so than on the fateful day of September 11th last year. Within hours, Dr. Kathy Winings, the Dean of the UTS Extension Center, had volunteered herself and the local UTS resources to help in the disaster recovery effort, a notable and natural effort and putting faith into action.

Up at the main campus, big changes were also going on. In June 2001, the school graduated its two most notable students, World CARP President Hyun Jin Moon and his wife Jun Sook Moon. During their stay at UTS, the Moons invested a great deal of effort into encouraging the kind of institutional changes that would allow the school to not only survive but flourish.

These changes were evident on every level, including the academic, where Hyun Jin Moon brought a fresh and compelling vision of the theology of the Completed Testament Age based on his direct personal experience. A huge conference run by World CARP put UTS back on the map as a conference site, and in June 2001 the founders, the Reverend &

We were certainly grateful to have such an illustrious visitor as Stanislav Shushkevich who is regarded as one of three people—together with Boris Yeltsin of Russia and Pres,Kurachov of the Ukraine—who made a decisive contribution in the breakdown of former Soviet Union. A few years ago, Mr. Shushkevich became one of the founding members of the Ambas sadors of Peace.

The Korean STF or *Hunsoo-seng* first began in 1992, the second class was held in 1996, the third in 1997 and the fourth in 2002 to establish a tradition of service for the world and nations. CARP IOWC in the Baltics

Lithuania has a profound spiritual history. The skyline is dominated by the three crosses in memory of the first Christian missionaries were martyred by pagans around 700 years ago. Through their sacrifice and many others, Lithuania became a deeply Christian nation. In recent times, it suffered terribly, first under Nazi Germany and then under communism. Today there are church buildings in every corner of the city. Some are still active, but others are almost abandoned. Lithuania's youth are being torn between their Christian past and the siren song of Western materialism.

A few days ago the newly formed CARP IOWC (witnessing) team stood on top of a hill overlooking the city of Vilnius, the capital of Lithuania. We are here because of Hyun Jin Nim's great hope and desire to develop World CARP in the Baltic countries, where when he saw such potential during the 21 day workshop last year.

Our World CARP team is really practicing the motto of loving one's enemy. The Baltic nations have a lot of historical resentment towards Russia. More than 130,000 people who fought the hopeless war against their giant neighbor were caught and executed or sent to the gulag in Siberia. The clergy was not exempt. Yet today our CARP members have come from those far away places in Siberia such as Krasnoyarsk, Irkutsk and Ulan-Ude, the very cities where once all these people from Baltic were sent to languish in the gulag. We have come from Russia to love and testify to the Lithuanian people. We all feel very deep responsibility to indemnify the turbulent history that has swept through this tiny nation.

Now our little team is busy preparing for the 7-day seminar to bring the harvest of our campaign. We are ashamed of the small result and too early to say anything about development of the mission. However we are determined to make the foundation to breakthrough 2003! Here is the testimony of Masha Rayova, one of the more successful team members,

Masha Rayova

I became a heartistic magnet like a mother who gave birth to a child. What mother would quietly watch her son or daughter being raped by a villain? She would dash forward without second thoughts, and in her righteous indignation she is stronger than anyone in the world and she will save her prince. In witnessing I feel an analogy with Joan of Arc, who thanks to her youthful burning heart could lead men to liberate her country. She was thought to be crazy, she forgot reality, but she carried out that task earnestly believing in her responsibility for her nation as a loving daughter. That is why, in the very moment when I lose hope, I don't get disheartened, but fight until the end, keeping my dream clear.

Once I set a condition to find a person like Hyun Jin Nim. When the day was through and I could find no one, I felt terribly frustrated, but then in the back rows of the Vilnius University library I found him—my star, my heart and my dream. First, we agreed to meet again after his exam. I was very worried because his love for justice and truth was higher than mine. But we talked for hours. I just shared about myself, my childhood, about where I had been, and I tried to show him God's work in my life from my very birth without mentioning Him.

When we follow this principle, people with developed hearts come to us. After two months in Lithuania, one person invited us to go to see a historic city of Trakai in his car. All our team went; we saw an incredibly beautiful tower amidst the lake. This was our 'witnessing project' - we laughed, danced on the bridge at the sounds of a frog choir, and talked about life. Another time we went swimming and fixed a late snack, then sang songs in Russian, Lithuanian, Buryat, Mongolian, and Japanese. This is what leaves an unforgettable mark when we are tied with the Principle and friendship.

People come to us under amazing circumstances. Each of them is a very interesting, outstanding person: some because of their simplicity, sincerity, willingness to help any time, others because of depth of their thinking. Still others go in for yoga, or want to become best professionals in what they do, or are cheerful like one of our brothers. This shows God's desire to create a team strong in every respect.

The Principle says that such a group will receive support and people will expect it to succeed. The most important thing is to not lose your roots. We remember those who in stark darkness of centuries past dedicated themselves to the will of God and now pass their precious experience, their foundation to us. Saints and sages exist everywhere, in every nation, and we should not forget about them. They want to see people who will embody their dreams and become better, who will reach the victory. They accompany us always, so let's celebrate the great victory together after the great battle.

Philippines: SFP starts in Mindanao

The launching of Service for Peace in Mindanao was held in Butuan City, attended by 227 delegates composed of university and college students from different regions. The host city prepared two days of activities including a welcome banquet and SFP Education. Service projects were held in three venues and included dumpsite cleaning, orphanage visitation and working with the City Social Welfare and Development Lingap Center.

Service Projects

The Service Project was held at three simultaneous sites after the motorcade that tour around the downtown area. The first was in dumpsite area where delegates from different regions helped and worked together in segregating recycled garbage and washed it to be useful and saleable.

The second area was in City Social Welfare and Development (CSWD) or Lingap Center. The center cares for abused, abandoned, maltreated and raped children aged 12 years old and below. The delegates helped out by cleaning the surroundings, planting trees around and washing their clothes as well singing educational songs with them. They did much the same in the House for the Girls for young adults and teenagers. The delegates became more aware of their environment and learned to help less fortunate people.

Welcome Banquet

During the welcome banquet, Lorden G. Vismanos, City Administrator, welcomed the delegates by reading the message of the City Mayor, Hon. Maria Leonides Theresa Plaza. Mr. Joshua Josol, Asst. Executive-Director for Mindanao expressed his heartfelt gratitude to the delegates for attending this very historic event, especially those who had come from far places like Davao, Digos, Iligan and Cagayan de Oro.

The keynote speaker was Mr. Toshiaki Iwata, W-CARP Consultant for Asia. Mr. Iwata explained more about the concept of Service for Peace and its goals and objectives. He emphasized the culture of our society must be changed into the ideal by living for the sake of others, taking ownership and teamwork. 'World peace cannot be established by money, politics, power or knowledge' he said 'but through us by practicing true love and living for the sake of others.'

A brotherhood and sisterhood ceremony was held between different regions and faiths, exchanging tokens and the dandelion symbol of *Service for Peace*. A sumptuous dinner and entertainment followed after the speeches that brought a livelier atmosphere in the banquet.

SFP Education

Mr. Joshua Josol, Asst. Executive Director for W-CARP in Mindanao, introduced the W-CARP Theory of Education to the participants, since most of them were very new. They were so

Profiles: People of CARP

Katsushi Mito: President, W-CARP Russia

Kazushi Mito, 45, was born in Hiroshima, Japan and graduated from the University of Hroshima majoring in business management. He was blessed in 1982 with Keiko Mito, also from Japan. They have one daughter and two sons.

In his early spiritual search he had explored both Shintoism and Buddhism, but in his student years he converted to Christianity after reading *Resurrection* by Leo Tolstoy. He launched the 'Ethics Research Association' on campus

and started preaching purity. That activity made him famous in his campus and he naturally became a target for witnessing CARP members.

After joining CARP in 1976, he worked in various positions in Japan, and in 1986 he received an assignment to USA. where he made a new start. After several years of work in leadership positions in Japan he began from the bottom again — doing frontline fundraising and witnessing. Eventually he became a regional leader based in Seattle, Washington.

'Looking back, going back to the frontline again was a very helpful experience, he says. 'A good leader shouldn't get used to sitting in the chair. If the members cannot break through, a leader must go out to the front line and show the best result.' That's been his creed for years.

In 1994 he moved to Russia with his family to support the growing mission to the former Soviet Union, which had been pioneered by US CARP since the summer of 1990. For the past eight years, he has been working mainly in the field of witnessing and education. In fact, he currently combines several missions – President of W-CARP-Russia, Director of Witnessing Department of FFWPU Northeast Continent and the Regional Leader of FFWPU Moscow.

From the very beginning, his encounter with the *Divine Principle* helped him understand many things that he had already intuitively felt. Now, after the experience of twenty-six

years of public work he concludes, 'Principle really works! Many times the reason why we are not successful is simply because we don't believe and don't practice Principle enough,

In particular, his experience of witnessing in Japan, USA and Russia has made him something of an expert in this field. 'Fundamentally there's not much difference in witnessing in these three countries or anywhere else,' he says. 'Spiritual laws are the same everywhere. If you bring internal victory, external result will surely come.'

Now, his main concern is how to provide good education for all CARP members, and particularly to young leaders, in order to enable them to inherit God's tradition of living for the sake of others and create families with a high internal standard in the future.

In his free time, which is rather limited, he plays guitar and saxophone, sings and composes music. He still likes fishing, and at the World CARP leaders' meeting in Kodiak last year was one of the top fishermen!

Founder's Page — Preparing for Sacred Love

From: an address delivered July 4, 2002 in Washington DC to an audience including the 300 young people of the Summer of Service

I heard there are 300 young people working for Service for Peace. Are you dating each other? If there are some boys or girls who are thinking that way, can we say that this group is pure, or scarred? Both sexes have to say absolutely no when it comes to dating. You can greet each other naturally, as by hugging, but brothers and sisters should work together to keep purity, until you receive the blessing from God and you can exchange the most precious gift of your love organ with your spouse. Then God's blessing will be accomplished.

When you receive your spouse do you want to give something genuine, or something already used? Some Americans may say, 'I don't care if my wife is a second-hand woman, or my husband is a second-hand man.' Will God condemn this, or welcome it? Will you welcome that or even spit at it? If you really keep yourself intact and genuine, God will knock at your door and ask to dwell with you.

The time will come that you will have to marry. Will you say yes to God when He gives you that challenge? What about marriage? When the time for marriage comes, who should initiate it, you or your parents? Many kids say their parents have nothing to do with it, and they pick their own spouse. When children have that kind of nasty individualistic attitude, will God dwell with them? No; He cannot touch them.

That's why children must protect their love until marriage, and then you need permission from your parents and

ancestors to use your love organ. Ancestors means all of them, including **God**. The entire universe and the cosmos should welcome your marriage. That is where the True Parents emerge and the true lineage emerges.

Remember, your mind and conscience are in the position to inherit vertical lineage from God, and your body inherits a horizontal lineage from your physical parents. But due to the fall, the vertical parents were chased away. Horizontal parents sided with Satan. This is the most fearful phenomena of the fall. Our life takes place in such an evil environment.

First Love Should Be Sacred

If you keep purity until marriage, and you find your spouse, the first moment you make love is the time God will come. It will be a sacred moment at which you inherit true love, life and lineage from God. That is the place your spouse will come as the king and prince of the Kingdom of God., and you will be the spouse of that prince and king.

This is such a fantastic situation I am describing, about lovemaking within pure blessed couples. The wife is prepared

Opinion: Face AIDS Truth

The world is now at the brink of a real AIDS explosion. The number of people infected with HIV may soon leap from 40 to 100 million, ROL news agency reports. The fastest HIV infection growth rates in the world were registered in former Soviet republics, Caribbean countries and India.

However, governments everywhere are slow to fact up to the real situation. For example, a recent AFP report said that China could have more than 10 million cases in the next five years alone. The very next day, China angrily denounced the report, saying that they 'did not accept its findings' even though ironically other experts say that the number is almost certainly understated. The UN reports that without a drastic improvement in treatment, more than 70m people are expected to die of AIDS in the next 20 years.

'AIDS is the most fearful epidemic that humanity has ever faced,' said Kofi Annan, UN general secretary, calling recently for a dramatic expansion in funds for research and cure. According to him, it would take up to \$10 billion annually until 2015 to curb this disease. In many parts of the world, treatments which could save millions are unavailable simply because of the prohibitive costs.

In Russia there are a million people infected with HIV, says Vadim Pokrovsky, director of the Russian Science and Methodology Center for AIDS Prevention and Treatment. He says that 194,000 HIV-infected individuals have been registered for the first 4 months of 2002. 'It shows only the number of registered patients. The infection can be identified only after a thorough medical examination, which is why this number should probably be multiplied by five,' he stressed.

Pokrovsky believes that the young generation should be instilled with skills how to avoid infection in the first place. This year 100 million rubles (about \$3.2 million) have been allocated to AIDS treatment in Russia but this amount will only suffice for 500 patients.

Changing Attitudes Towards Sex

More important than the issue of money, however, is the question of changing attitudes and behavior toward sex, still the leading cause of HIV transmission. Of course, we are not ignoring the other means of transmission through drug use, or more innocent causes such as blood transfusions, birth from an HIV positive mother, and so on. Yet sex is still the main problem. Whether casual sex as practiced in the Western world, child marriage, polygamy, adultery or unfaithfulness, the truth remains that any form of sexual contact other than in a faithful lifelong marriage is dangerous.

Ignoring the overwhelming role of irresponsible sex in spreading the disease is like trying to fill a bucket that has holes in the bottom. No matter how much money and effort is invested, the problem will continue to grow.

Review: Men in Black II

Indeed, their leader looked like a pocket Moses on his way down from Sinai. The joke is expanded at the end of the movie, but I won't spoil one of the few unexpected moments of the film.
