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#### **DOES ABSTINENCE WORK?**

The Worldwide Debate-What shall we teach young people about sex? There has been a vigorous debate in the U.S. and around the world about what kind of education to give our young people regarding intimate relationships, sexually transmit-



ted diseases (STD's), AIDS and other risks to their health and their lives. Although most religious teachings are very clear about not having sex outside marriage, many people of faith struggle about whether this message works in reality in our day and age. After all, isn't AIDS decimating minority communities in most of our cities? Wouldn't the use of condoms reduce the spread of this terrible disease, save lives and maybe reduce the number of "baby mamas" to boot?

Furthermore, in a secular society, people of faith cannot demand that public schools teach the religiously based standard of sex only in marriage. During the past two years we have been exposed to a barrage of news stories in the U.S., and around the world, declaring that abstinence education doesn't work. If the experts quoted in these articles are correct, why fight for a standard that not only seems to be outdated, but isn't effective? But, before we all give in and invite an "AIDS prevention" group over to teach our young people "safe sex" by showing them how to place condoms on a banana, there are a few questions all of us ought to consider. Why are STD rates often highest among those who report the highest rates of condom use? Why are most youth (and adults) never informed about condom failure rates for the most common STD in the U.S. (human papillomavirus, HPV), one that can cause a cancer that kills more women in the U.S. than does AIDS? Why are the words "marriage" and "monogamy" forbidden in many public school classrooms?

Since "comprehensive" sex education that claims to teach about both contraceptives and abstinence is taught in three out of four American public schools and promoted as being effective by the "experts," why is one in four girls in the U.S. infected with an STD. Why are nearly half of African-American girls infected?

What kinds of "abstinence" do comprehensive sex education programs teach our young people? Several widely used comprehensive curricula invite youth to come up with their own definitions of "abstinence" and suggest various kinds of sexually-oriented behaviour as options to consider.

As the founder of a program that teaches young people about healthy relationships and the benefits of marriage that has been used in thirty-eight states and seventy

countries, I can tell you that we also invite young people to think about ways they can have fun without becoming sexually intimate. Activities include playing sports, going for a hike, cooking, doing community service, going to a movie with friends and other activities to get to know someone while still keeping your clothes on. Consider the following poem by Hilary Collins, a 13-year old from Harlem, NY, called "Real Love": When he says "Let me whisper in your ear" or "I'm gonna give you the world" And stuff like "when you gonna come get with me?" That's not real love. When he calls you "Shorty." "Baby Mama." and "Sexy Lady." That's not real love. Real love is not conditional. Involving STDs or pregnancy before marriage. But real love is Commitment, Significant, and symbolizes the life-long journey to find... That special one.

There are those who will say that Hilary is not representative of all young people, and that's true. They will say that when Hilary becomes sixteen or seventeen, and is going out with her boyfriend, she may be guided less by her ideals and more by her passions, and that could also be true. They will say that, because 60 percent of U.S. teens have sexual intercourse by age eighteen, they need to be taught about condoms and birth control.

I do not disagree with giving young people accurate information about these things, but what I find most disturbing is when the only conversation offered to them, when the possibility of a committed lifelong love relationship is never mentioned out of fear of offending those adults who do not enjoy such a relationship. You may be surprised to hear that a 2007 MTV/ Association Press poll found that 96 percent of unmarried youth and young adults ages thirteen to twenty-four disagreed with the idea that "marriage is an outdated institution." Ninety-two percent said they definitely or probably would get married someday; 64 percent thought it was "very likely" they would remain married to the same person for life.

You may dismiss this as the idealism of youth. You may say that even if they do get married, half of them will divorce within five years, but consider this question, does the high divorce rate for new marriages reflect the fact that we have focused on preparing young people for so-called "safe sex," but not for a committed love relationship-that is, a healthy marriage? What sense does it make to deprive our young people of any discussion of monogamy and marriage?

Former health commissioner Fred Jacobs justified rejection of federal abstinence funding in New Jersey, the vast majority of which benefits urban minority youth, by saying, "monogamy is not a bad idea, but having government of New Jersey dictate these things for families is not something that we wish to do."

As the ex-health commissioner knows very well, no one is "dictating" anything to anyone. Why are twenty-two governors opposed to receiving federal funds for programs that inform our youth about the personal and community benefits of people being faithful to one sexual partner? Surely most rank-and-file Democrats believe

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# CALIFORNIA PROPOSITION 8 A VICTORY FOR MAR-RIAGE AND FAMILY

A week before the Nov. 4th elections my husband heard James Dobson's radio programme Focus on the Family. Dr Dobson himself was speaking about the campaign in California to pass Proposition 8 which defines marriage in the California constitution as only between a man and a woman. He revealed an extraordinary God-inspired strategy of how this (subsequent) victory was possible, a story that shows how God is working in America today and also the way to bring about future victories.

On this programme Dr. Dobson publicly thanked the Mormon Church for contributing to most of the 30 million dollars to support Proposition 8. He said that without the Mormons the success of the Proposition 8 passage would not be possible. The Mormon HQ church donated the largest institutional amount and thousands of Mormon families gave 4 figure donations. From the Evangelical side, Focus on the Family and Concerned Women for America gave about \$500,000 each.

It was amazing to hear the most powerful evangelical leader in the USA publicly thanking and praising the work of the much persecuted Mormon Church and stating that they were the essential group for the success of Proposition 8. Dr Dobson gave another piece of astounding information. He said that "thousands of pastors and individuals", had done 40 day fasts for the passage of Proposition 8. On the same programme he interviewed a pastor on the 36th day of his fast. On November 1st in a San Diego stadium 40,000 religious supporters of Proposition 8 gathered for a "Day of Prayer and Fasting" for the propositions passage. Why did the Evangelicals do the 40 day fasts? They knew from the Bible that this was something men of God did in times of crisis and they felt this vote was a final showdown for America-God's side supporting marriage between a man and a woman simply had to win or America would be lost. The Gay lobby were in the beginning very confident to defeat Proposition 8 in California because California is one of the most liberal states. After that their plan was then to undertake a nationwide campaign to pass the same pro-Gay marriage resolution in every state. Along with the legal recognition of gay marriage they planned a number of accompanying legal mandates like public schools teaching children about homosexuality as a "civil rights" issue.

In addition to the well financed campaign, and the fasting, Evangelicals and Mormons visited every house in California explaining the many legal and societal consequences if the Proposition was not passed. I live abroad and was visiting my sister in a midsize California suburban town in early October. To my surprise at 5pm rush hour on a regular weekday at a stop light in town, there were 10 persons, mostly mothers and teenagers picketing in

favour of Proposition 8. My sister told me that these people were out there every day. Similar picketing was taking place in nearly all the towns and cities of California everyday.

Perhaps the best candidate for both the Republican presidency and the vice presidency this time in terms of experience and capability was Mitt Romney. However, according to newspaper accounts James Dobson vetoed Mitt Romney as McCain's VP choice because Romney was a Mormon. Evangelicals have persecuted and rejected Mormons as not "true" Christians. It took the crisis of Proposition 8 to bring Evangelicals and Mormons together to save America. The victory in California points the way that America's future will depend on religious groups working together, putting aside old controversies.

The Rise of the Religious: The Future of America and the World Will be Led by Married Religious Persons.

Many years ago Richard Panzer invited me to a National Abstinence Conference. Most of the hundreds of participants were evangelical Christians and conservative Catholics. The keynote speaker was the only congressman in the US Congress who was actively helping the Abstinence movement with pro-abstinence legislation. The congressman gave a beautiful talk including humorous and loving antidotes about his wife and 6 children. But in the audience I felt a certain coolness- this congressman was a Mormon. It's interesting neither Evangelicals nor Catholics had even one Evangelical and Catholic congressman that would champion abstinence. Only a Mormon. Recent academic research shows that the most successful in all societies are religious married persons. At the same Abstinence conference I heard a presentation by Dr. Patrick Fagan of the Heritage Foundation. He showed his research that shows that the world is quickly dividing into two-on one side are those who marry and stay married and practice a religion. This group of families is doing well in every way - economically, academically, socially, in emotional and physical health etc. The second group- those who do not marry or do not stay married and do not practice a religion-this group is on a downward spiral in every way-declining economically, socially, in health and in numbers as well. Significantly he showed graphs that this phenomenon is true in every culture-the same trends can be documented in the US, Europe, in Latin America, Africa, Asia, the Middle East etc. Mormons prove this. In spite of a long history of severe persecution in America, they have a strong religious praxis and are on the ascendancy in the USA in nearly every aspect of society. They are forming quality families. 4 out of 10 American idols last season were Mormons.-their purity and goodness was shown each time they sang. They ban sexy outfits and movements. The author of USA's best selling book for young persons, a best seller like Harry Potter is by Stephanie Meyers a Mormon housewife who chronicles the love between a vampire and a girl, in a subtle manner that promotes purity and true love. # True Family Values

#### **Brother and Sister's Realm of Heart**

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# A. Brother and sister's realm of heart.

- 1. A brother's attitude toward his sister stems from the love of their common parents for her. We learn how to love our brothers and sisters by observing the way our parents love each other.
- We naturally love those whom our parents love.
- Parents' mutual affection, appreciation and cooperation becomes the children's ethical norm.
- We love our siblings through our mother and father's loving
- When a son loves his sister, he is loving his parents.
- When he hates his sister, he is actually hating his parents, and, by extension, he is denying himself and his value, and also his relationship with his future wife and with God.
- 2. In loving his brother and sister, the child learns a sense of his identity and respect for the identity of others.
- This becomes the basis for respecting others. He learns empathy, value of sharing and giving. He learns the meaning of cooperation. This expands into mature friendship.
- The conscience grows through sibling relationships.
- The sense of the integrity of each person is the basis of human rights.
- Valuing every person as my own brother or sister is the spiritual foundation of democracy.
- 3. Loving your brother, he becomes part of you.
- When your parents love him, you feel benefit.
- If he becomes wealthy, you enjoy visiting his mansion as if it were your own home.
- If your elder brother becomes famous, he can lift you up and help you. His success is felt as part of your success.
- 4. In the brother-sister realm of heart, one learns a sense of order, hierarchy of position and status.
- Elder and younger brothers, elder and younger sisters each embody different qualities of relationship.
- Elders inherit parental responsibility for the younger. Elders identify with the parents first, and then tend to treat their younger from the parental position.
- Thus, boys and girls learn how to be parents.
- The younger children learn the same thing by taking care of their nephews and nieces.
- The younger's respect for his parents also is given to his elder siblings, who are loving him with some degree of parental love (love for father to the elder brother; love for mother to the elder sister).
- This is the basis of respect for the authority of those who are

taking public responsibility (owners, managers, governors, teachers).

- 5. Order within the family translates into order within society.
- Brother and sister's realm of heart is necessary for proper relationships between different positions in society. There are many complicated relationships, but the principle is the same. In fact, brother and sister's realm of heart includes an empathetic happiness when your sibling excels, receives accolades and advances. Cultivating true brotherhood and sisterhood in the family thus trains us to live well in society, and thus creates a peaceful society.
- Brotherhood is the foundation for democracy. However, without the presence of God through a strong religious life, democracy has the same limitations as we would have as brothers with no parents.
- 6. Where there is no brother and sister's realm of heart, relations are frequently poisoned by envy and jealousy of the favoured sibling. This is illustrated by the biblical stories of Cain and Abel, and Joseph and his brothers.
- Since elder-younger siblings order is set through the love of their parents, without true parents, social order ultimately breaks down.
- Rising crime rates in the inner cities are due to the lack of parents. Without parents, these children could not develop respect for their brothers and sisters.
- Crime rates correlate with single parent families and illegitimacy.
- From this pattern of the lack of parental love leading to conflict between brothers, wars have proliferated, plaguing
- The problem is that men and women have never experienced the conjugal realm of heart nor practiced the parents realm of heart.
- 7. With universal brother-sister love, the world will welcome you.
- You don't want to kill your brother or sister out of jealousy over your parents' love, neither do you wish harm to come to any person, no matter how privileged his position. We all have the same parents: God.
- Social institutions, denominations, nations are each different. But relationships among them should be brotherly, centering on the harmonious relationship of their representatives. This will create a beautiful society.
- With a pure mind and heart, you can travel anywhere and relate with anyone with genuine love and respect.
- Ultimately, brother and sister's realm of heart enables each person to relate well with all twelve personality types. This means each person has a "round personality" (not sharp and

that abstinence and marriage are good things that they would like young people in their communities to think about. When did delaying sexual involvement and fidelity become only "Republican" values?

Former Surgeon General Everett Koop advised "young people must be told the truth, that the best way to avoid AIDS is to refrain from sexual activity until as adults they are ready to establish a mutually faithful, monogamous relationship." What's wrong with that message?

There are risks that condoms have no power to reduce. Sexually active boys and girls ages twelve-sixteen are more likely to engage in high-risk behaviours including alcohol and drug use, running away from home, getting into trouble with the police, being suspended from school, and for girls, attempting suicide.2 High school girls who become sexually active are three times more likely to become depressed and to attempt suicide than high school girls who wait.3

In contrast, youth who made a promise to abstain from sex delay having sex an average of twenty-seven months longer than teens who don't make such a pledge (after controlling for other factors, scientists say that eighteen months of the delay can be attributed to making the abstinence pledge).4 This gives them more time to focus on achieving their personal goals, including graduating from high school, going to college, starting the career of their choice and finding someone who really loves them and is mature enough to commit to starting a family together. Abstaining teens are more likely to graduate from college, half as likely to go on welfare and half as likely to get divorced and, as adults, have higher personal income.5

Contrary to the media barrage attacking abstinence education, a number of scientific studies have demonstrated the effectiveness of at least a dozen abstinence education programmes in reducing teen sexual involvement. Furthermore, the National Sex Survey, the largest and most scientific sex study ever conducted in the U.S. found that married people had more sex than unmarried singles and enjoyed it more, physically and emotionally. The reason is not hard to understand, for most human beings, uncommitted sex is not fulfilling and often leads to disappointment, pain and regret. Modern science confirms that age-old guidance to reserve sex for marriage is true in the twenty-first century, even as it was thousands of years ago. Now why is that surprising?

Further studies reveal that one in ten young people believe that life is not worth living or is meaningless according to a report by the Prince's Trust. The report also showed that a quarter of 9-16 to 25 year-olds felt depressed. Family was cited as being the key to their happiness, but too often young people find they don't have the crucial support.

Because of their being biased against traditional marriage and family the government has been fuelling the breakdown of our society. All the evidence shows that marriage between a man and a woman is the best way for providing stability and prosperity for children. The time is long overdue for the government to face the facts about the importance of traditional marriage. # WAIT UK GOALS FOR 2009

Following our successful application to become a registered charity, the WAIT UK Management Committee met on 10th December 2008 to discuss the way forward.

We agreed that our new charity should focus on the following in 2009:

- a) Schools we hope to visit some schools in order to introduce WAIT, give talks or presentations on character education, relationships and love. These could be followed up by a WAIT team performance.
- b) Education we plan to make a relevant presentation to WAIT members once a month to help them develop a stronger sense of purpose as a WAIT member. This would compliment their performance training!
- c) WAIT IRFF cooperation We will continue the partnership between WAIT and IRFF (International Relief Friendship Foundation) which played a big role in our trip to Uganda in 2007. WAIT plans to support the IRFF project in Uganda by cooperating with IRFF, whose director is also a trustee of WAIT UK.
- d) Like-minded groups we will be contacting like-minded groups so as to do much-needed work in the areas of reducing HIV/AIDS, STIs, teenage pregnancy and hopefully youth crime through improving young peoples' character and outlook in life.
- e) In the first quarter of 2009, we will also focus on



seeking funding to run WAIT UK (pay for trainers, hall hire, transport costs and refreshments). We are also looking to set up our own WAIT office in Central London.

# Twelve Ways to Improve Your Marriage By Stephen Stacey

10. Learn what each other's love buttons are: Basically, there are six ways friends interact, and if Bret and Anastasia are to keep their feeling of love alive, they need to discover what type of interaction they both enjoy most and make those interactions

happen regularly. As friends, they can spend time talking, doing something together, expressing friendship through touch, doing a chore usually done by the other, giving a gift or creating a surprise for the other, or expressing appreciation. Out of these six methods of interaction, when Anastasia interacts with Bret in those ways he particularly appreciates, he recognizes he has been loved and responds by moving closer to her in his heart. Anastasia might prefer others among these methods of interaction. When they learn to recognize each other's key love buttons and consistently initiate interaction along those lines, they are more likely to maintain their friendship and love.

11. Spend time together nurturing friendship and love: They could make sure they have some fun time together, share a hobby, or have regular, inspiring dates, even if they have to be home dates because of the children or inexpensive dates because of finances. They could also learn the art of creating great anniversaries to celebrate the lasting, deep love they have for each other.

12. The art of romance: Finally, Bret and Anastasia could learn how to be especially, profoundly and passionately romantic, leading to moments that are consistently and deeply enjoyable for both of them. For example, Bret could learn to take more time being romantic well before they get into the bedroom. Anastasia could learn to express the most feminine aspects of her nature in the bedroom, using feminine lingerie, perfumes, massage oils or candles. With all the practice they will be getting, they can dream of their sexuality being far more profound in their sixties than in their twenties.

Summarizing these twelve topics is useful. Healthy relationships are built upon the following skills - one's ability to live for your partner, one's ability to respect both oneself and one's partner (to see from God's viewpoint), the ability to create a team that creates a home, raise children and possibly serve the community, the ability to be friends to each other, and lastly, the art of romancing. From a developmental viewpoint, these are obviously the key skills (live for others, respect, team skills and Friendship) that we should teach our children so they enter into their marriages with all the key relationship skills in place, ready to be matured over time through

their love for each other. In spiritual terms, the development of a child's love and sibling love are important factors in succeeding in conjugal love.

As we've seen, Bret and Anastasia can do many things to improve the quality of their relationship. Knowledge is good, but actually changing oneself and substantially developing one's relationship skills to become a better partner takes time, patience and encouragement. It would be nice to be able to say, "Now I understand; I can do it." But it doesn't usually work like that. It's more like building a house. It's often easier to create a new house from scratch than to restore an old one with its dry rot, poor construction and slanting foundation. By the time we've reached twenty or twenty five, we've probably developed some poor patterns of behaviour that have often passed down through our families through several generations and are difficult to change. Sometimes our lineage lacks one of the core elements of love that are needed to make us feel whole, thus we grow up and have unfulfilled childhood needs, which have to be fulfilled before we can develop new skills. Sometimes our parents completely lacked one key relationship skill and we have no mental models to call upon. Building those models requires time in which to develop some small mental models that we join to make a complete, well functioning larger skill. Sometimes we've grown up in a family where there has been a lot of disrespect, and trying to bring more divine mental attitudes into the relationship takes hard work. Sometimes we face enormous internal resistance. We know what the right thing to do is, but something stops us from doing it. We know it would be good for our relationship to forgive each other more quickly, to date more often, or to hold a regular planning meeting-but we just don't do it. Because of these and often barriers to growth, partners need to learn to be patient with each other. Healing or rectifying takes time.

I've found that some of these habits can be quickly adapted into a relationship, for example Bret and Anastasia can use a cell phone or electronic diary to remind each other that Tuesday night is date night or that Sunday evening they're agreed to cook together and then hold an informal couple meeting. With other relationship skills, its best to learn them one at a time. When they encourage each other for all small improvements (just as one encourages a child learning to write), the skill is more likely to become permanent. Then they can both move on to the next skill.

With consistent improvement, patience and forgiveness it becomes increasingly easier to sustain love over the years and with fewer negative occurrences there's more energy for positive ones and for the creation of love that both Bret and Anastasia can enjoy.
