

BOARD DELAYS ACTION ON POSSIBLE RELOCATION

The UTS Board of Trustees met in a marathon five-hour session at the Seminary on Friday, February 2, 2001. The key agenda item was possible relocation to 4 West 43rd Street in New York City. A variety of pros and cons were discussed. In the end, the major sticking point was HAS-UWC's plans



major construction there. Board members were unwilling to authorize a move without the Seminary obtaining a

3-5 year lease to operate. Since the Seminary has not yet gained this level of commitment, the board delayed any immediate decision.

The board did, however, assign an ad hoc committee to investigate the situation further and the full Board agreed to meet again in three weeks time.

In other business, the board heard proposals for the sale of a conservation easement and property development at Barrytown. They ratified the current curriculum and added Dr. Winings to their Academic Committee. They also made a commitment to vote on at least one new Board member with links to the New York Extension Center. President Hendricks reported on activities at Barrytown and Dr. Winings reported on New York City.
