<u>A</u> Search For the Truth by Ruth Montgomery

The Big, New, Best-Seller by the Author of "A Gift of Prophecy-The Phenomenal Jean Dixon"

A famous journalist explores the world of psychic phenomena and writes a startling report of her own personal experiences.

"Why were we born?

"What is our true purpose in life?

"Is it possible for the living to communicate with those who have passed beyond the threshold that man calls death?"

The author of "A Gift of Prophecy," the fascinating story of prophetess Jean Dixon, tells about her further experiences in the field of psychic phenomena and her search for the deeper meaning of life.

She goes on to ask, "What is birth? Did we live before; and is birth, like death, simply another step in a continuous progression of the soul?...Do we have a mission in life? If so, how can we determine that mission? Is there a Divine plan which to an extent prearranges the steps by which we earth-bound souls surmount our difficulties and eventually progress through other steps toward the eventual goal? What is that goal?

"...The yearning that people feel for contact with one who has a highly developed psychic sense is understandable; yet how much better it would be if people recognized that within themselves are depths that they have not probed. Jesus told us that the 'Kingdom of God is within' each of us. It is for us, then, to enlarge our own perception, and learn through daily meditation to listen to the 'still, small voice' within. This process takes patience and effort, but the rewards are many. Through the utilization of our own psychic talent we can develop self-reliance, greater awareness of the needs of those around us, and a sublime sense of Oneness with God.

"If this book does no more than arouse us to the unlimited capacity within ourselves, it will have served some purpose. But, hopefully, it can perhaps further awaken us to the realization that the good we do here advances our soul's progression, while thoughtless acts retard it. Not one act or deed of ours goes unnoticed on the 'other side.' When we eventually cross that threshold ourselves, we will take up where we left off here. It is not up to God, but up to us to decide whether our next stage of life begins on an exalted or lowly level. Messages from those who have 'gone on' make clear that the way to save ourselves is to lose all thought of self, in the unselfish service of others. If this precept could be accepted by all mankind, there would be no warfare or other acts of violence.

"Charles P. Steinmetz, a celebrated electrical engineer, predicted in 1923: 'Someday the scientists will turn their laboratories over to the study of God, and prayer, and the spiritual forces which as yet have hardly been scratched.' In the two and one-half decades since the outbreak of Morld Mar II, we have seen a trememdous revival of interest in psychic phenomena. The crash program that Steinmetz foretold has not yet occurred, but if all of us could approach the subject of the paranormal with open, inquiring minds, it could come to pass during our lifetime. The church is exploring the psychical and parapsychological as never before. A generation or two ago, a pastor who dared admit to an interest in this field would probably have lost his pulpit; today many men of the cloth are taking the lead in organizing groups for psychic study.

"The Beverend William V. Rauscher, rector of Christ Episcopal Church in Woodbury, New Jersey, says of the subject: 'If we were to remove from the Bible all the accounts of mystical and psychical happenings, we would have very little left. Without the Resurrection experience, we would not even have a Church. The very things the New Testament speaks about involve psychical and parapsychological study; our community with Christ and our loved ones who blend with us, the communion of saints, angels and archangels, the whole company of heaven, and the entire heritage of our mystical Jesus, and everything related to it in the world of the unseen demand scientific inquiry.'

"Emphasizing the growing interest not only of clergymen, but of psychiatrists, neurologists, physicians, university professors, and scientists, in the paranormal, Rev. Rauscher continues: 'I cannot think of the transfiguration of Christ, illuminating himself and glistening, without thinking of the whole meaning of the human aura, the halos around the saints in religious art; or the appearance of the prophets on the mount with Christ, without thinking of the reconstituting of matter, and in the resurrection to a physical form. I cannot think of prayer without thinking of some form of telepathy relating my mind to the mind of God.

"'Christian people must face up to the truth of their faith. These doctrines are either true or false. Either our loved ones are with us (after death) or they are not. Either the Communion of Saints is a reality or it is not. When we attend church services, do we not realize that there are more invisibles than visibles? If a person is convinced of life after death, his philosophy of life must change. In the Communist philosophy there is no room for this view. I believe psychical research could change this negativism. More and more the Church will have to become the laboratory of the spirit. In the church today we should continue to witness a new interest in psychical research, and all parapsychological studies. If any church is not interested, it is behind the times! '

"In that spirit of open-minded inquiry, this book was conceived and written. As a lowly beginner at the threshold of psychic discovery, I do not pretend to understand the mysterious laws which govern mental telepathy, clairvoyance, precognition, miraculous healings, apports, and apparent communication with those beyond the grave. I believe, however, that the search for this knowledge conflicts in no way with the tenets on which the church was founded. How many times through the ages have ministers quoted the twelfth verse from the fourteenth chapter of St. John: 'Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth in me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father.'

"St. Paul, in the twelfth chapter of I Corinthians, admonished the early Christians: 'The manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues."

"These talents, like all others, were bestowed on man in order to be used and developed. Christ told us: 'Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you.' Unless we ask for further knowledge of God's universe, and seek for it, we cannot find it. Unless we knock, the door will remain closed."
