- (6) How often do you have inter-action or fellowship among family members either through meeting, writing letter, or contribution to the News Bulletin?
- (7) Are you well informed about what our Master is doing and the work of other groups and countries other than your own? The information will give you great strength and spiritual up-lift and bring us closer together as one Heavenly Family.
- (8) What king of individual talents do you have to utilize in this work? Some examples are a writer, teacher, counselor, lecturer, minister, public speaker. organizer. secretary etc...

 (9) How do you overcome disappointment and discouragement? The nature of our work is sometimes depressing. With inter-action among other family members and with the help of prayer this can be overcome. It is not as difficult to overcome our individual disappointments and discouragements when you compare them to the hardships and persecutions of the early Korean family.

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SPEECH DELIVERED BY MISS JUANITA CASTRO BEFORE "WORLD ANTI COMMUNIST LEAGUE AND ASIAN PEOPLE'S ANTI COMMUNIST LEAGUE," HELD IN TOKIO AND KYOTO JAPAN. SEPTEMBER 15 TO 20, 1970

The story of what has happened in Cuba until the present is very long. Batista's dictatorship and Fidel's tyranny cover eighteen years. I'll endeavor to be as brief as possible in telling what I have witnessed during those long and dramatic years.

The politico military difficulties in Cuba began with the unjustifiable military coup of March 10, 1952. This was the original sin. This was the main cause of what is happening today. Batista's dictatorship spawned Fidel's Communist tyranny.

By March 10, 1952, Cuba had found the way to lay the foundation for an institutional order based on the 1940 Constitution; this was the same Constitution that Fidel promised to re-establish after the victory of the Revolution while he was still at the Sierra Maestra. This promise, which was one of the fundamental points of the revolutionary program that the Cuban people supported, was never fulfilled by Fidel, as he fulfilled none of his other promises.

After March 10, 1952, the majority of the political institutions, as well as the constitutional order, were disrupted. However, due to the productive ability of the Cuban people, workers, employers, professionals and technicians and their hard work, social progress continued despite the political mishaps. This means that before January 1959 the crisis in Cuba was eminently politico-military. It was not, as some have tried to make it appear, a socio-economic crisis. In January 1959, a new era of hope and recovery began. The immense majority of the people believed that the great opportunity had arrived to organize Cuba by institutional means and start it on the path of true democracy, with its accompanying attributes of social justice for all and individual and collective freedom.

In the socio-economic order, the majority wished for reform in the areas of national life that still lagged behind, so as to put them on a par with the general levels already attained and thus, begin a new phase of greater progress by means of social evolution, a more positive and advantageous means than subversion and violent revolution.

It is only fair to recognize that every section of society, from laborers to businessmen and professionals, were ready to play their part unselfishly. Fidel had this great opportunity within his grasp and rejected it for submission to a historically bankrupt system, Marxism Leninism, and to its disreputable agents in Cuba, the "Old Guard" of opportunists in the Communist Party. To do this, Fidel revived Red mummies who had not made one single sacrifice during the Cuban Revolution and who had participated in every political fix in the country and allied themselves with every dictator or tyrant who happened to be in power, among them, Batista himself.

On the other hand, the true revolutionaries and fighters were relegated and eliminated periodically.

Those who rule Cuba today are not the ones who fought on the mountains and in the cities, but opportunistic agents of Societ Imperialism who contributed absolutely nothing to the victory of the original Revolution.

Before Socialist Communism was established in Cuba, Cuban workers had, among other rights guaranteed by the 1940 Constitution: a minimum workday; a progressive work schedule; the right not to be dismissed arbitrarily from their jobs; retirement and social insurance; yearly vacations with pay; sick leave; maternity benefits; maternity leave; per diems and compensation for industrial accidents; medical assistance; hospitalization; payment during vacations or leaves of absence; seniority; arbitration commissions that dealt in labor conflicts; labor representation before official, autonomic, and private organizations; right to administrative appeal; right to file labor claims; payment for overtime; the right to freely organize unions, federations, and confederations; automatic pay raises; and the right to strike.

The labor laws that protected Cuban workers were about the most advanced in Latin America, as proven by those who have studied and observed them, and those whose minds are not biased by ideological sectarianism.

What Cuba needed was to increased and extend its development and the essential techniques to reach higher and fuller goals which would have eliminated periods of unemployment, particularly in the rural areas where, due to the predominantly agricultural economy of Latin American countries, there exists a lack of sources of permanent employment. This lack should be met with the creation of more industrial enterprises in agriculture and in cattle raising, and with the reforms adequate for social evolution.

Cuba--before Communism--was like a painting that lacked only the final strokes. Among these final strokes were political and administrative honesty; respect for the Constitution of the Republic; and raising the standard of living of the rural and urban minorities that lagged behind the majority of the population. In truth, it was neither a perfect country nor a paradise; it would be demagoguery to say so since nothing human is perfect.

Human works can aspire to creat higher levels of well-being and happiness, both individual and collective, but never perfection. Whoever promises perfection and an earthly paradise is deceiving his fellowmen. However, a higher level can be reached in the economic, social and political areas.

Nevertheless, the betrayal of the present rulers has surrendered the Cuban people, through force and deceit, to the worst of all politico-economic systems, as is Marxism Leninism when it is put into practice. Life under this ruthless system is about the worst ever known to Mankind.

Cuba has had the misfortune of going from one tyranny to the other. For this reason, the great majority of the Cuban people fervently hope for a better future that can never be similar to either the past or the present. Our solution should be <u>something</u> new and different: This solution will be reached only if we look to the future.

Since Marxism Leninism was established in Cuba the Cuban peasant has lost whatever land he owned; and those who owned none, the hope of ever owning any land under the Socialist-Communist regime.

Cuban parents have lost their right to educate their children in the school and religion of their choice. Parents cannot exercise custody of their children. Children are forced by the Communist Party to obey only the State, not their parents.

Professors cannot exercise academic freedom or teach their subjects in accordance with strictly scientific curricula. Many capable teachers have been expelled from the Universities, Secondary Schools, Elementary Schools, Technical Schools, because they refused to submit to the arbitrary orders of the Communist Party.

Study curricula have been altered to adapt them to the low academic level demanded by the Communist Party to be able to graduate elements pliable to Communism.

Universities and all other teaching establishments and institutions are militarized.

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Professors cannot exercise authority. The Communist Party is the sold ruler of the universities and all other institutions of learning by means of terror and the force of arms.

Students are not allowed to study and hold objective debates on the academic texts required for the training and thorough knowledge of a profession. The textbooks for Marxist-Leninist indoctrination that have taken the place of those previously freely chosen by the faculty, are placed above any training for a profession or trade. The students are forced to study for the profession or trade determined by the Communist Party, and are allowed to graduate only when they can recity by heart the Marxist-Leninist textbooks that are of far more importance in a Socialist Communist State than the subjects pertaining to any profession. The Communist Party is far more interested in training "Communists" than good professionals; therefore, honest professionals and technicians have been removed from their positions when they refused to accept Communist tyranny.

Other consequences of the Communist regime are these:

The Cuban people lost their freedom, their independence and their sovereignty; the Cuban people lost the right to freely elect their government; the Cuban people lost their right to practice the religion of their choice; the Cuban people lost the right to better themselves and to raise their standard of living; under Communism they have no satisfactory future; the Cuban people lost their peace and happiness; the Cuban people are enslaved by international Communism and State totalitarianism.

From all this we can learn a dramatic lesson: the Marxist-Leninist system, State Communism, will never be able to raise a country's standard of living or solve its problems. All it can hope to do is to make them worse. Under the politico-economic system, wealthy people are made poor, and the poor, destitute.

Every factory belongs to the Communist State; every business belongs to the Communist State; every parcel of Cuban soil belongs to the Communist state; every material object belongs to the Communist State and the State can dispose of it as it wishes.

All human beings also belong to the Communist State that disposes of them cruelly, as if they were so many beasts of burden.

It is not an exaggeration to affirm that under the Marxist-Leninist Communist system EVERYTHING--ABSOLUTELY EVERYTHING-belongs to the insatiable Communist State.

The correst position for the leaders, and the one the people should demand of them, is the development of social justice, freedom, and opposition to all extremisms.

The "liberals" and the "leftists" who join the Communists in their struggle for power are swept away, jailed or executed, as soon as the Communists control the government of a country. The Communists, as soon as they reach power, devour those who were their allies only yesterday.

The Communists have no peace among themselves, and much less where their circumstantial allies, as they call the "liberals" and "leftists" are concerned.

The Communists eliminate and kill each other. They constitute a voracious plague that first attacks circumstantial allies, and later, turns to destroy its own ranks.

The Cuban people know the Communists are the agents of the most inhuman and cruel imperialism ever known to Mankind.

The Communists are traitors to their homelands.

The Communists are fanatic followers of an idealogy that rejects and proscribes every noble human feeling. The Communists want to enslave Mankind by imposing Marxism-Leninism, a system that is nothing more than a totalitarian dictatorship that sustains itself in power by means of military force, terror, repression, and mass murder.

The Communists speak of "freedom", "equality", "workers's rights", "independence", "sovereignty", "social progress", "peace".

However, the Communists, when they reach power, practice slavery, inequality, do away with workers' rights, destroy independence and sovereignty and submit themselves to the Soviet Empire, eradicate progress and social conquests; the people lack everything, and the "peace" they are so vacal about is used to disarm those who oppose their insatiable appetite to conquer peoples and nations, it turns into...war...and extermination.

The "peace" the Communists demand serves to disarm democracy so they can continue their aggression and wars without opposition.

That is why thousands of people from the Communist countries escape daily, crossing barbed wires, walls, fortified shores, and seas teeming with torpedo boats that attack and murder men, women and children.

Fidel began the communization of Cuba because his plan was not to build a free and prosperous socity, but rather to turn Cuba into an aggressive military base to spread Communist Imperialism to the Americas in exchange for commanding the aggressive action, and exercising totalitarian power as the highest representative of International Communism in the Americas. Fidel will never be satisfied with merely being the dictator of Cuba. He hopes to dominate every country in the Americas. His ambition is ridiculous; it knows no bounds. To satisfy his ambition he is capable of using, indiscriminately, any armament given to him by Communist Imperialism which, in turn, uses him as a tool of its subvertionist and interventionist policy.

Since Fidel's only interest are his aggressive plans, the

Cuban people are suffering the consequences and the country has already been destroyed by a regime that is an utter economic and social failure.

Communist Imperialism is set on taking over America, Asia and the whole world as well. They are very close to here. From Red China and North Vietnam they intend to seize other countries in Asia, consequently, Japan is not out of danger. If the Communists are not stopped in Vietnam, another mistake will have been made by those nations who are obliged to face this danger and to fight this war aginst the Communist expansion.

There shall not be peace in Vietnam until the war is won. The military retreat would be a victory for the Communist aggressors.

The anti-Communist fighters in Vietnam as well as in other countries, --Cuba, for example--must be helped to win the war, not to detain them in their advance instead.

Before Cuba fell prey to Communist Imperialism, the Cuban people, who were not and are not Communists, did not have the experience necessary to understand what those intellectuals, politicians, student and labor leaders who followed Communist ideology were capable of doing, they masqueraded, as they do everywhere, as defenders of freedom, democracy and peace.

This was our first mistake. We neither studied nor observed what the Communists had been doing since they took over the first country. We forgot their history of treason. And so, we were deceived.

Later on, the Revolution played into their hands. Many Cuban revolutionaries, who were not Communists, but who, nevertheless, allowed the Communists to infiltrate the revolutionary cadres, ended by being persecuted, inprisoned or executed by the very same Communists that a short time before appeared to be their friends and allies. Thus history and experience prove that those Communists, that may today appear as "patriots", if allowed to spread their ideology and use their tactics, tomorrow will be the slave masters of the people.

Those Communists who demand "freedom", tomorrow will refuse us that freedom.

Those Communists who demand respect for human life, tomorrow will be firing at us when we stand before the "wall". Those Comcunists who are allowed to use the law for protection, tomorrow will destroy that very same law, so that we are depraved of its protection.

Communist propaganda, in order to disarm the revolutionaries, the Christian Democrats, the Christian Socialists, the Liberal Socialists, etc., spread the view that it is a sin for liberals to be anti-Communists.

That's how they began in Cuba. First, they created a collective and individual fear for anti-Communism. Later, the Communists took over the Revolution. And, finally, the Communists eliminated, imprisoned, or banished from the country, and even executed, all those who had accepted without question the complex of not being anti-Communists.

Thus they set their trap. The same kind that the Bolsheviks used in Russia to become sole masters of a Revolution that had been forged by many different revolutionary fronts. This way, the Communists exterminated those who had not dared to be anti-Communists.

Those who defend "coexistence" should explain why the Communists do not allow anyone who disagrees with them to "coexist" with communized countries, and why they continue to advance aggressively and to devour, in the name of "coexistence" and "world peace", any nation that borders on a state ruled by a Communist regime.

I have witnessed how the people of different levels, who gave so much aid to the Revolution, were inhumanly deprived of their normal means of support, and how only the few groups that give their allegiance to the Communist Party are given jobs that even in their case are miserable, and for which they are paid slave wages.

And yet, I was present also when long before all this Fidel would criticize our father for being too generous with the peasants in his farm and for not acquiring more land.

Later, I saw him, already a tyrant, disposses those same peasants of their homes and lands, and extend the fences down to the very sea, to be sure that he owned everything inside the immense Communist Estate.

Nowadays in Cuba every worker and peasant is Fidel's slave.

I have seen how families, who made their fortune by means of honest, productive work, or inherited it legally, were dispossessed Those families were not anti-Communists. They didn't even know what Communism was. However, they were on the Communists' black list; they were considered enemies, and thus, deprived of their properties.

Now, they have no means of support. Many have committed suicide. Others are dying slowly, consuming the meager food rations allowed them by the regime.

I have seen parents lose their children to Marxist-Leninist indoctrination system that trains children and young people in the fanatical obedience to the Communist Party, to the extent that they denounce their own parents as "counter-revolutionaries".

I have seen parents and children jailed in inhuman political prisons and in concentration or hard labor camps, and I have heard personal witness accounts of thousands of executions before the "wall". I have heard Fidel say:

"Each day that passes is one more battle we win in the American nations. Each year we remain in power means consolidation of the offensive we are planning and executing to spread Communism to every nation in the world."

Fidel thinks only in terms of war.

I had the opportunity to know most of his plans, even if only in general outlines.

I am fulfilling a duty towards my own conscience in denouncing them in time.

It is task of every citizen of fight against communism. Our goal must be: "Victory over Communism first and World Peace then!"

* * * * * * * OF STARS AND MAN by Ira Wolfert

In recent years, astronomers have been discovering one strange new thing after another far out in space--quasars, pulsars, collapsing stars--a weird array of surprises that challenge some of our most fundamental theories and tidiest assumptions about the universe. Out of these discoveries an awesome new view of creation is emerging. Many of its factors are still unclear, subject to future findings. But I've looked over the shoulders of astronomers in Australia, Europe and the United States, and I've seen this new vision growing in coherence and grandeur. It is a colossal vision of man's own emergence from the birth and death of stars. This is the story I want to tell.

But first, consider how inconceivably huge is the stage on which creation unfolds. A quick trip out into the universe at the speed of light--186,000 miles a second--will help set the scene. In a mere 1 1/3 seconds, traveling at that speed, we pass the moon. In five hours we're out of the solar system. But it's four years later before we approach the nearest star.

Going on through the Milky Way--the family or "galaxy" of stars to which our solar system belongs--we pass a star only every five years on the average, despite traveling at more than 11 million miles a minute. Yet there are 100 billion stars in our galaxy. It would take 80,000 years to go from one end of it to the other. Once out of it, space is really empty. For the next galaxy, Andromeda, is two million years away!

But even after Andromeda we're not really out in the wide open spaces yet. The galaxies come in groups. Some groups have as few as three galaxies. Our own galaxy is one of a cluster of about 17 which astronomers call, without cracking a smile, the Local Group. The largest group, Hercules (it would take us 300 million years to reach it), containing billions of stars. In all there are at least ten billion galaxies in the known universe. Such are the dimensions of the stage. Now let's watch the drama itself.

Clouds of Gas. The action starts with infinitesimal particles of atoms already onstage. How these particles came to be is still a mystery, but they are the original of the "dust that turns to dust". Radio telescopes and space probes have discovered them scintillating and blowing like winds everywhere. One kind of particle is called a proton; it has a charge of positive electricity. Another kind is called an <u>electron</u>; it has a negative charge. Because of their opposite charges, they attract each other. When they come together, the electron is held in orbit around the proton. One electron and one proton together make the simplest of the elements, the hydrogen atom.

It is next to nothing--a plus and a minus holding each other-yet is the basis of everything. Thin mists of hydrogen atoms form and drift through the galaxies. Occasionally, these atoms come together and form a cloud of gas. If enough atoms are present, the gravitational attraction each exerts on its neighbor is sufficient to hold this cloud together.

So it all commences, and a star begins to form. Gravity may be the weakest of the cosmic forces, but it never gives up, and the bigger the mass of the hydrogen atoms, the stronger the gravitational force.

For the gas cloud to congeal into a star, it has to be big. And when an astronomer says big, he means big--in.this case ten trillion miles across, or nearly 3000 times bigger than our whole solar system. At this point, the cloud starts getting smaller as gravity becomes so strong that the hydrogen atoms are squeezed ever tighter together.

Now a new chapter begins. Compressed, the cloud begins heating up. When the cloud reaches 100,000 degrees F. at its center, a critical point is reached. At that temperature, the hydrogen atoms collide so violently that they separate into plus and minus particles again. The cloud-ball, now some 100 million miles across, is turned into "plasma"--a mixture of two gases, one consisting of negative electrons rebounding from each other, the other of positive protons rebounding from each other. The rebounding goes on for about ten million years, as temperature constantly rises under the constant squeeze of gravity.

Finally, the ball is only about a million miles across, and the temperature at the core has risen to 20 million degrees. At this point, a thermonuclear "war" begins. The protons are now smashing together so violently that they fuse. Ultimately, four protons fuse to make the nucleus of a new element, helium. The fusion is similar to the process that goes on in a hydrogen bomb. But while bombs produce helium by the pound, nature does it--in our sun, for example--at the rate of 564 million tons a second.

Thus, a star is born--when the fire of nuclear fusion is ignited. The explosions outward from the nuclear furnace in the center exactly balance the in-drawing gravitational force, and the dimensions of the ball become stabilized. Our own sun, an average star, is in this state--its size about a million miles in diameter.

Collapse and Regeneration. Still, the gas cloud that has become a star gets no rest from gravity. After eons have passed, with the hydrogen at the star's core "burned" and only helium left, the nuclear explosion begins to subside and gravity starts crushing the star again. This generates enough heat--200 million degrees--to produce a higher level of reaction, which fuses the helium nuclei together into the nuclei of carbon atoms.

From here on, the history of a star depends on its size. If the star is a big one, it will go on to a series of collapses and ever hotter reaction. In a star that is massive enough to generate a temperature of 600 million degrees, the carbon atoms are fused into still heavier elements. Thus, through successive collapses and regenerations, a star can create the heavier elements found on planets like earth.

Once a large super-star gets hot enough to create iron, the outward explosions subside and, under the mounting pressure of gravity, ti begins a final collapse. Robert Jastrow describes this in his book, Red Giants and White Dwarfs: The Evolution of Stars, Planets and Life:

"The ultimate collapse is a catastrophic event. The heat drives the central temperature up to 100 billion degrees, and every possible nuclear reaction comes into play. It is in the last gasp that the heaviest elements, those extending beyond iron, are produced. The star rebounds from the final collapse in a great explosion which disperses to space most of the elements manufactured in its interior during its lifetime."

Chinese astronomers in 1054 A.D. were the first to detect such an explosion. At the position of this huge exploded star, or super-nova, there is today a great cloud of gas known as the Crab Nebula. This gas, or explosion debris, is still expanding at the rate of 1000 miles a second.

The earth is made almost entirely of such debris, slowed down enough for gravity to start shaping it again. About 4 1/2 bilion years ago, when our solar system began gathering out of hydrogen gas, the gas was already "enriched" by atoms of all 92 of the heavier elements, sprayed out into space by stars that had exploded long before. This rich lebris gave birth to our sun, our planets and moons. Then, out of the abundant carbon, oxygen and other bits of long-dead stars, complex life arose on earth. Since exploded stars are continually creating the heavy elements of life all over space, it is quite possible that the universe is swarming with life.

Down the "Black Hole." When a star explodes, some of its matter is blown out and away. What happens to the inner part depends on the star's original size. The core continues to collapse. It may stabilize when it is down to about the size of the earth, as a super-dense, white-hot star called a "white dwarf." A teaspoon of its matter weighs more than a ton.

In other cases, the collapsing is arrested only when the star has reached a much higher density still, and the size is only 10 or 20 miles across. Now the force of gravity has become so excruciating that it crushes all the electrons right into the protons, producing neutrons, which have no charge. Then it jams all the neutrons so tightly together that the whole star becomes a single giant nucleus. This is called a "neutron star," and its density is now so great that a teaspoon of its material would weigh a billion tons.

Today some scientists speculate that in occasional massive stars, the catastrophic events of gravitational collapse might continue even further and overshoot even the dense states of the white dwarf or a neutron star. They speak of the ultimate conclusions as "black holes," as if the matter collapsed to an elemental state of infinite density, and perhaps beyond. A "Black hole" would be fathomless, characterized by a gravity so colossal that it emits nothing, and nothing falls into it can get out-not a sound. not even heat or a light wave.

Bright Lights Out There. The first neutron star was discovered by British radio-astronomers about three years ago. Since then, more than 40 have been found. They are the pulsars--unbelievably strong, pulsing radio sources. They pulse regularly at each rapid rotation. The pulsing of the fastest reveals that is is spinning around its axis 30 times a second; slow ones may pulse only once each four seconds.

"Black holes" have never actually been discovered. However, some scientists believe that evidence for their existence lies in the mysterious quasars, the brightest lights in the universe. The quasars (or quasi-stellar objects) lie at the outmost edge of man's radio-telescopic reach. The first quasar was discovered in 1963, and hundreds have been spotted since. They seemed impossible to explain, for they are as large as a million suns, and burn a hundred times brighter than our entire galaxy. What could they be?

Now several of the world's best-known astronomers, including Thomas Gold of Cornell University, see quasars as a product of the wholesale cataclysm caused by a "black hole". When the vast gravitational force that implodes a huge star system down to nothing has nothing left to resist it, that force reaches out to pull all the nearby stars into itself, thus making the "black hole even bigger and stronger. When the hole becomes big enough to start swallowing all or part of a galaxy, the millions of stars involved put out all their energy to keep from falling in. The crackling heat of a whole galaxy fighting to avoid going down a "black hole" could be what creates the enormous quasar beacon. When Dr. Gold told me this, I could not help feeling sorry for those frantic, doomed stars. The pity he saw on my face was perhaps not the least remarkable event he had ever watched going on in the universe, for what makes the story the astronomers tell so utterly astounding is the fact that the play itself produced its own audience to weep over it and be exalted by it--us.

This is the new picture of the universe that is shaping up in the observatories of five continents, the picture with which mankind will live in the years immediately ahead. It is far from the flat, mechanical, cut-and-dried universe of the 19th century. Though we still have no ultimate answer, we now see more clearly than ever that we are a part of this vast drama. We know that mankind was made out of star dust, forged in burning suns and born in a cataclysm. To know with what awful grandeur the material of our persons was produced gives man a new sense of his relationship to God.
