News from Ukraine

Two Second Generation youths from the United Kingdom, Elliot Yamamoto and Simran Rai of YSP, arrived in Moldova for an exchange of experiences and best practices with Moldova YSP. Every day they came to the Peace Embassy and helped with the Sunflower Project. On 19 May they gave training in peacebuilding to 26 young people, both refugees and Moldovans. They met with a team from the youth NGO Pro Bono and discussed future collaboration. Passing of Prominent Ambassadors for Peace







Signing the Belovezh Accord on 8 December 1991

On May 3, former head of state of Belarus Stanislav Shushkevich passed away at the age of 87. One week later, on May 10, the first president of independent Ukraine, Leonid Kravchuk, passed away at the age of 88. They, together with former Russian President Boris Yeltsin, had signed the Belovezh Accord on December 8, 1991, in Belarus. This document effectively brought an end to the Soviet Union, which officially ended on December 25, 1991, with the resignation of President Mikhail Gorbachev. In the following years Dr. Shushkevich and Mr. Kravchuk became outstanding Ambassadors for Peace, participating in numerous events. Both had a profound respect and admiration for the vision of True Parents and worked in support of UPF activities until the end of their lives. We wish them a smooth transition to the spirit world and pray that they will assist True Parents' providence in the former Soviet region. – Jack Corley
