On the first morning, she was a bit reluctant to stay, talking about home, but by the end of our stay she was very reluctant to go, sad to leave and say goodbye to everyone, having made friends with young people of all ages.

After morning service and breakfast, the main part of the day was usually taken up with a variety of team games, most of them created by the indefatigable Simon Rosselli, and implemented by Alex and Aryan, with some help from other young adults. There were no winners and losers, in the sense that all the different teams gradually accumulated points as the games went on through the week, but the striking thing was how all the team members were involved, and played their part, whether 8, 18 or 28 years old. All the games were fun, especially those involving water and people getting wet, trying to catch water-filled balloons, or tripping up and falling into a plastic swimming pool while 'blindfolded' in search of a soft plastic baseball bat with which to smite other 'blindfolded' opponents in "Last Man/Woman standing". You can imagine the scene.



The team spirit was also abundantly evident in carrying out practical responsibilities during the day, particularly at meal times, with food preparation in the kitchen, serving everyone in the main hall, and even in the washing up. Those of us who are more advanced in years all felt so much warmth and love from the children and young adults serving, as we queued up to receive our breakfast, lunch and dinner. 'Food is love' as someone famous once said.

All good things must come to an end, and this experience came to a wonderful climax on the final, laughter-filled evening with each team presenting a well-prepared sketch, reflecting and summing up everyone's shared experience, both young and old. (Who will ever forget the re-cycled toilet paper!!!)

Everyone was thanked on the final morning before departures, and some individuals singled out for special recognition, but we would still say a big 'Thank You' to all involved in the huge effort to make the week so special for each person who came, and say without question "It was worth it!"
