Could the Japanese government's request to the Tokyo District Court for a dissolution order against the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification (formerly known as the <u>Unification Church</u>) be seen as acquiescing to the demands of the terrorist who

assassinated former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe?

The intense hatred directed at Shinzo Abe transformed into a surge of emotions that engulfed society and was directed towards the Family Federation and its followers. Japanese society reacted according to the intentions of the terrorist.

It is said that Abe sending a video message to an organization related to the Family Federation (formerly known as the Unification Church) evoked in people a feeling of him having a friendly relationship with the religious organisation. However, even in Brazil, where the constitution mandates the separation of religion and state, it is common and legal for politicians to attend events of religious associations and deliver greetings. Isn't it contrary to the separation of church and state for the state to persecute a particular religion?

Is there solid evidence that can be verified, that Shinzo Abe was in a close enough relationship with the Family Federation to warrant severe criticism from the media and

public? Perhaps Japanese society needs to calmly reassess and reevaluate what the hatred of a terrorist has brought upon society as a whole.

Essentially, doesn't the media have a role to play in curbing the government's recklessness?

The purpose of all media, including television, newspapers, radio, and online media, is to convey information. In addition, media professionals are required to have a professional ethic that conveys the truth to society, and as professionals take responsibility for the content of their reporting. I hope that taking such a responsibility will lead to "watchdog journalism" and a professional reporting that tells the truth.

In the Japanese parliament, the position of members of the <u>Family Federation</u> was ignored, and there was no criticism of the government's request for a dissolution order that would strip the believers of their places of worship and other sources of support. Some have even pointed that the situation is similar to the totalitarianism of pre-war times.

Just like in Japan, in Brazil as well, freedom of religion and its rights are guaranteed by the constitution. Suppressing what is naturally recognized as an individual's fundamental right would constitute a violation of constitutional rights.

I hope that Japan will not open the door to totalitarianism, akin to the neo-fascism that arose in Italy after World War II. I urge the Japanese government and the judiciary to listen carefully to opinions from active members of the <u>Family Federation</u> and explore possibilities other than issuing a dissolution order. The court's decision will also serve as a recommendation to Japanese society. Japan must never step into a 'dark age' where freedom is taken away.

As someone involved in journalism and the legal profession, I believe that opposing any possibility of dissolving the <u>Family Federation</u> is essential. Restricting and prohibiting fundamental rights such as freedom of religion, freedom of speech, and freedom of association would be unacceptable.

Does the infringement on religious freedom in Japan have the potential to spread from Japan to other countries?

Of course. Attacks on freedom of religion carried out by Japanese politicians would quickly spread

worldwide as a chain reaction. There is no doubt that Brazil would also become one of the countries affected by such an influence.

Japan is respected around the world, but Japan's current position of issuing an order to dissolve a religious organisation that have not been criminally punished, does not seem reasonable from a common sense and ethical point of view.

I also feel that there is an ideological aspect behind the movement to dissolve the <u>Family Federation</u>. We must not forget that many instances of national division, conflict, and war have started from ideologies. Behind the persecution of the <u>Family Federation</u> lies the ideology of communism. It is particularly important for those who identify as conservatives to perceive this as a serious issue. Volunteers should gather and engage in democratic opposition activities against the dissolution of the <u>Family Federation</u>. (Interviewer: Satoru Ayamura, São Paulo)

Kazuo Shii making a new admission on his X-account 4th Sep. 2023.

On 4<sup>th</sup> September 2023, Kazuo Shii, chairman of the Japanese Communist Party since 2000, made a new admission about their decades long campaign and wrote on his large Twitter / X account with more than 200,000 followers,

"Despite being criticized so much the Unification Church still continues its "mass weddings". We must not relax our thorough pursuit."

The "thorough pursuit" he mentioned in his new admission is part of the JCP's deliberate effort to eliminate anticommunists.

In an interview in November 2022 with Shii, the Shimbun Akahata, the daily organ and official national newspaper of the Japanese

Communist Party, it was made clear that the fierce campaign after the assassination of former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe 8<sup>th</sup> July 2022 is the communists' "final war" against the Unification Church / Family Federation.

Shii said in the Akahata interview that the war had started already in 1978 at the elections of the governor of Kyoto. "This time", he said after the Abe assassination – *making a new admission at the time* – "we will fight thoroughly and completely until we win the struggle."

Many times, communists prefer to work undercover, often through so-called front groups. One would rarely hear them admit publicly that they are behind a certain project or group. A good example is the *National Network of Lawyers Against Spiritual Sales*, the body through which they have been fighting the Unification Church since 1987.

Award-winning investigative journalist Masumi Fukuda explains,

"Almost all of the lawyers in the Network were affiliated with the former Socialist Party and the Communist Party, [...] were connected with extremist groups and North Korea, and were ideologically leftists and self-styled atheists." (The Truth About the National Network of Lawyers Against

It has indeed been in line with a long-term communist strategy to weaken voices like the Unification Church, that is highly critical of the God-denying, totalitarian society communists systematically work to create, the likes of which we see in China and North Korea.

Cropped china, said that it is not only the Japanese Communist Party that exploits the assassination of Shinzo Abe. Also Chinese President Xi Jinping believes he may use the assassination – and the alleged grievances of Tetsuya Yamagami, the terrorist behind the murder, towards the **Unification Church** – to stain the reputation of the church and the legacy of Abe and undermine freedom of religion in Japan and other countries.

Pillsbury served from 2014 to January 2023 as director of the *Center on Chinese Strategy* at the *Hudson Institute*, a prestigious Washington, D.C think tank. In addition, he has been an adviser to most American presidents since Richard Nixon. He now works for the *Heritage Foundation, one of the top 10 think tanks in the world*, as Senior Fellow for China Strategy.

Pillsbury added,

"It's obvious to me why China also wants to undermine the memory of Abe. He was the most anti-Chinese Communist Party Prime Minister in Japanese history. The Japanese Communist Party not only attacks the Abe wing of the LDP, but also the work of the Unification Church in Japan and around the world. China attacks the Unification Church. At the same time, it attacks everything Abe worked for."

deprogrammers and Christian pastors involved in the abductions, who received substantial amounts of money from the relatives of the believers they deprogrammed.

When the lawyers were consulted by the believers' parents, they first introduced them to the deprogrammers. If and when deprogramming was successful, the lawyers took over from the deprogrammers as 'handlers' of the former believers, made them plaintiffs, and filed lawsuits. The anti-**Unification-Church** group, including Attorney Kito and journalists Yoshifu Arita, and Eito Suzuki, still defends deprogramming to this very day, and claims it was performed to 'protect' the former members of the **Unification Church**." Fukuda explains how thousands of members of the Unification Church were kidnapped, forcibly confined and deprogrammed. Not only were they forced to denounce their belief. They also had to prove that they had separated themselves from the church by asserting they had been "victims of spiritual sales". The network of lawyers made them go to court against the Unification Church demanding to retrieve the money they once had donated.

More than 4,300 members were kidnapped and deprogrammed in this way. With so many forced by leftwing lawyers to sue the Unification Church, this communistinspired activist network managed to inflate figures immensely and portray the Unification Church as a group "detrimental to public welfare".

Fukuda reveals how for decades, the leftwing lawyers in the afore-mentioned network have used tactics like coercing exmembers to join their lawsuits against the **Unification Church**, making up evidence, and extorting money from a perfectly legitimate religious movement, that is constantly being attacked and painted black by those lawyers. Masumi Fukuda calls those lawsuits fraudulent. She says,

In fact, there are many cases in which relatives consulted with the Network on how to force the donorsbelievers to sue." (*The*

The network was actually organised in order to put an end to the Unification Church, now called the Family Federation. In her articles the Japanese journalist exposes how the activist lawyers, many of them hard-core communists, used trumpedup charges against a new religious movement, while the "crime" it has committed, is to be against communism.

In this way the communists wage their "final war" against the Family Federation, by pushing for its dissolution order.

It is hard to think of a more dishonest, immoral and sly way to attack one's enemy.
