District 1: Libby Henkin

Libby joined the church in 1972, and her church roles have included National Mobile Fundraising Team (MFT) member; pioneer and center leader for the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP); State Leader of Arizona; staff member at The World & I magazine and the Washington Times. She is currently an Executive Assistant at a non-profit organization.

Libby has participated in workshops for Russian students in Lithuania, workshops in Cheongpyeong, South Korea, and Original Substance of the Divine Principle (OSDP) seminars. She also spent several months in Korea and London under True Father's direction and attends church and tithes regularly.

Libby is a graduate of Ohio Wesleyan University (1972) and the Unification Theological Seminary (UTS), class of 1979. Having attended the 1982 Madison Square Garden Blessing with Stephen Henkin, she now has five children, of whom two are Blessed and three of whom have graduated from college.



District 2: Kathy Winnings

A member of the Unification Church since 1972, Kathy has helped develop the Unification Campus Ministry Association on Columbia University's campus; she was the co-creator of the Il Shim rite of passage program and conducted hundreds of workshops, seminars and trainings for Sunday School teachers, youth ministers, campus ministers and parents; she developed the first national curriculum for Children's Ministry and Youth Ministry for the Unification Church; and she has served on the committee that developed the initial WestRock Charter. Kathy served as the first president on the subsequent WestRock Council. She is currently a member of the Mid-Hudson Valley Unification Church.

Kathy is vice president for Academic Affairs for the Unification Theological Seminary (UTS), director of the Doctor of Ministry degree program, and Professor of Religious Education and Ministry. As also the president and founder of Educare, an educational consulting firm, she conducts training programs and seminars dealing with a wide range of educational issues from effective teaching strategies to curriculum design to service learning.

Kathy's other titles include the vice president of the Board of Directors for the International Relief Friendship Foundation, Inc.; a member of the International Executive Committee of the Board for the World Association of NGOs (WANGO); a Board member of the Religious Education Association; as well as the author of the book *Building Character through Service Learning*.

Kathy received her undergraduate degree in Elementary Education and Media Studies from Fordham University, her Masters of Divinity from UTS, and her EdD from Teachers College, Columbia University in the field of Religion and Education. She was voted into Kappa Delta Pi, the National Honor Society for Education, and received a special award for Women Educators from Teachers College. In 2007, she was a recipient of the Harriet Tubman Humanitarian Achievement Award. Kathy is also listed in Who's Who in American Education, Who's Who in International Education, and Who's Who of Women Professionals.



District 4: Lena Yasutake

Lena was Blessed in Marriage to Christoph Yasutake in 2002 and is the mother of three children from ages 9-5. Her parents are Rev. Levy and Claire Daugherty, who were married in the 2,075 Blessing on July 1, 1982. For the last 15 years, Lena's roles in the Unification Church have included serving as group leader at the Shehaqua Family Camp in Pennsylvania; Young Adult Minister, Children's Minister, Founder and Director of the Nursery Program, Founder and Director of Young Couples Ministry and Sunday School Teacher at the Connecticut Unification Church; speaker for Free Teens; speaker for the American Family Coalition; Service Team Leader and Project Coordinator for Service for Peace in Washington, D.C.; speaker for Pure Love Alliance; a graduate of Special Task Force (STF); Founder and Director of Performing Arts Outreach and Youth Minister at the Norfolk Virginia Unification Church; abstinence educator at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Family Life Institute; and small-group leader for youth, women and mothers.
