Michael Balcomb Shares the Word with Four Communities in North Carolina

Ever the traveler, Vice President of the Unification Church USA Dr. Michael Balcomb arrived at the Charlotte Airport in North Carolina on January 18, 2013 to visit four communities within the state.

His first stop that evening was the Charlotte Church Center, where Unificationist families from around the area and beyond had gathered for an early dinner buffet and fellowship. At 6:00 p.m., three songs were led by first-generation Unificationist Els Dussek and second-generation Unificationist Chung Hee Bessell, followed by welcoming words from the city pastor, Rev. Klaus Schick and a prayer from State Pastor Rev. Burgi Hutcherson. Rev. Michael Lamson, District Pastor of District 6, gave words of encouragement to the families regarding Foundation Day.

"With eager expectation, the families awaited the next step of the program – Dr. Balcomb's message," reported Rev. Hutcherson. "First, he focused our minds and hearts with a short video clip about True Father's life and his Seonghwa, and then he shared about how he received the assignment from True Mother to raise up the United States and bring a new spirit of hope back to this 'Elder Son Nation' by teaching the Divine Principle. He said that he realized quickly that the only way to be successful was to have Divine Principle lectures given by everyone, not just himself."

Dr. Balcomb then selected four volunteers – first-generation Unificationists Don Bramwell, Alba Flores, Hisae Baklarz, Els Dussek, as well as young Unificationist Samy Schick, son of Klaus Schick – all of whom gave presentations about the Mission of the Messiah with the PowerPoint and script provided by National Headquarters.

"Old and young members were inspired," said Rev. Hutcherson. "We concluded by watching an animated video called 'Creating a Life You Love' and were inspired by the young artist, Young Nam Heller, who put this together. We look forward to further lessons of the Divine Principle!"

After a short break with cheesecake, all the members gathered in a circle to participate in a Q&A with Dr.

Balcomb, during which they were free to ask any questions.

"Here in Charlotte, we all looked forward to Dr. Balcomb's visit with great expectations, as he was the highest representative of our American Movement visiting Charlotte since many years," said Rev. Schick. "We welcomed him also as a brother sent directly by True Mother to convey to us her heart and what is closest to it at this point – teaching the Divine Principle. Now the ball is in our hands, so to speak and needs to be passed on. Thank You True Mother, Dr. Balcomb and Rev. Lamson."

"It was a delightful evening overall," said Rev. Hutcherson. "We concluded at 9:00 p.m., filled with new hope and inspiration, grateful in our hearts about a deeper sense of awareness of the precious time we live in."

"Winston-Salem was also a stop on True Parents' 50-state tour in 2001, and True Father touched the hearts of many people and planted God's Word with his unending love and tearful prayers into this city," said Rev. Hutcherson. She continued: "Winston-Salem is also my husband's hometown and our family has lived here since 1992. The city pastors are my son, Dan, and his wife, Yemi, who is originally from

Spain. They volunteered to co-pastor this community since True Father's ascendance into the Spirit World. God is calling our youth to take leadership and this visit of Dr. Balcomb gives us so much hope."

The evening program opened with three songs followed by a welcome by Co-Pastor Dan Hutcherson, a short opening prayer by Rev. Burgi Hutcherson and introductory remarks by Rev. Lamson. Dr. Balcomb then shared the video about Father's life, as well as a message similar to the one he had shared in Charlotte.

Co-Pastor Hutcherson said, "I think everybody enjoyed getting to know Dr. Balcomb. It's not usual for a Headquarters representative to travel and visit the smaller communities, so having the chance to speak and ask questions to him was a welcome change of pace. His honesty about the state of our church and the vision for the future was refreshing."

"We were so impressed with the personal leadership of Dr. Balcomb," said Rev. Hutcherson. "He memorized the names of all the members gathered. Nobody ever visited our community and was so personal! We appreciated his testimony about his journey to Korea to receive the appointment from True Mother as the vice president of our church, his empowerment to make all of us Divine Principle presenters, and the time he provided for Q&A. The atmosphere was warm and embracing of all. It was a historical and joyful day for Triad!"

This is the state's largest Unificationist community and has been guided for 18 years by Rev. Mamoru Uyama until the summer of 2012, when Rev. Uyama passed his role as city pastor to his younger son, Benjy Uyama.

"Benjy has a heart for ministry," explained Rev. Hutcherson, adding, "I remember when he told me years ago that he would like to become a pastor. Hearing that from a teenager was amazing to me, and it's even more amazing that in last August it became reality. Since his appointment, Benjy is truly leading the community with heart and sincerity, while still attending college."

Pastor Uyama shared welcoming words and an opening prayer, and Rev. Lamson introduced Dr. Balcomb, who carried forth with the same program as in the previous cities. The volunteer lecturers for the Divine Principle training session were first-generation Unificationists Miyako Savage, Jack Hopper, Mr. Hidesugu Asada, Gail Davis, and young Unificationist Nikki Fladung. "I enjoyed Dr. Balcomb's testimonies," said Gene Huneycutt, son of Bob Huneycutt. "I am able to respect where he comes from and I am able now to put a face to his name."

A short break with refreshments and a Q&A session followed per usual, opening the floor for questions from members and guidance from Dr. Balcomb.

"Brothers and sisters felt taken care of with the internal guidance, the openness and honesty of the leadership and the inspirations they received during the program. I believe we will see great things coming from that community!" said Rev. Hutcherson.
