Seonghwa Anniversary Events in the Eastern United States

The **WestRock Family Church** in Tarrytown, New York celebrated the anniversary of Rev. Moon's passing with their Sunday Service on August 25, 2013 at East Garden, the former residence—turned church facility—of Rev. and Mrs. Moon when they lived in Tarrytown. The congregation sang worship-and Holy Songs in the East Garden Main Room. Susan Bouachri was one of four Unificationists who shared testimonies about "How True Father Touched My Life." Afterwards, the gathering savored a singing contest led by Justin Okamoto, the Young Adult Pastor, followed by youth entertainment, which included the lovely violin performance from Tiara Borneman and Marina Karr. In New York City, **the Unification Church NYC** held a special Sunday Service in which the usual rows of chairs in the worship hall were replaced with karate mats covered with white sheets. "We had people of all ages and a few guests," Pastor Andrew Love wrote to Unification News. "My Dad was there with his friend, so I saw the need to make everything super guest friendly." Singing of holy songs started the event, and Pastor Love briefly explained about the origin of the songs. "The spirit was pretty high, because our band played the songs really loudly, and the audience sang loudly to match the volume," he

wrote. Then videos about Rev. Moon's life were presented. Pastor Love gave a message about how belief in God and True Parents is only possible with action, because faith is proactive. He said of his message, "The purpose was to remind everyone that while True Father was a great man, his legacy is only as great as we can become. That takes the concept of True Father out of the clouds and into our lives." The congregation then participated in a quiz game about True Father's life, and the prizes were True Parents trading cards. Then, an abundant potluck lunch was shared, and Pastor Love commented, "It was a true miracle of culinary proportions."

The Unification Church of Alabama and Mississippi held a joint celebration on August 24th and set the theme for the program as "Gratitude for how Rev. Moon had personally affected our lives here in Alabama and Mississippi," reported Rev. Teresa Yamane. Rev. Joshua Cotter, who had been Alabama's state leader for 10 years, served as the main speaker. Rev. Yamane wrote: "Father Moon's contributions to humanity were vast, and we chose especially to highlight three areas at this first [anniversary] event: his inspiration for our interfaith work, his inspiration for business, and especially his inspiration behind the Blessing." Pastor Yamane added: "The comments from the audience, and the speakers themselves, was that it was a beautiful, moving, educational, and inspirational event, honoring a man with a mind and

vision so huge and extraordinary, that it could only be a person chosen by God for this time. It had a powerful impact, due to the heart, prayers and unity of the Alabama and Mississippi members. From this program we have recognized again, the power of prayer, and have decided to add a focused time of prayer one hour before our Sunday Service from now on to pray for our True Parents, our families, and our guests, and the healing and growth of our Movement."

For **the Bay Area Family Church**, there was a one-week celebration of the life of Rev. Moon. "It seems hard to believe that already one year has passed since our True Father ascended to the heavenly realm," reported Rev. Kevin Thompson, pastor of the Bay Area Family Church. "To honor his legacy on earth we held a weeklong celebration at Bay Area Family Church which was filled with deep, sincere prayer, testimonies, song, laughter, heartfelt notes of love to True Parents and above all celebration of the incredible life of the man we all love so dearly."

The Bay Area Family church held a kick-off evening on Monday August 19, 2013 filled with testimonies and singing. Rev. Thompson wrote of Monday evening, "Each brother and sister shared deeply from the heart about their experiences with True Parents over the past 40 years or more. The testimonies were deeply moving and many tears were shed. In the end a prayer of repentance and new determination brought the evening to a close."

On Tuesday August 20th, young families organized an evening for their young children to remember Father Moon. After a testimony by Donald Bond and stories of fishing with Father Moon from Pastor Thompson the children each offered a flower in remembrance of Father. Then the children wrote a note or drew a picture to send to True Parents expressing their love for True Parents. "It was a wonderful age-appropriate way of involving even the youngest members of our community," wrote Rev. Thompson.

The Youth Ministry and Young Adults organized their own gathering to share and remember Rev. Moon on August 21st. The testimonies about gratitude from the young group of Unificationists were moving, according to Pastor Thompson, because "this young group of Unificationists are all the product of True Parent's Blessings and in a real way are a product of the True Love taught by True Parents. The evening was one of reflection and contemplation of how to carry on the legacy of True Parents and their own parents."

For the live broadcast from Korea on August 22, 2013 the church was "packed to the rafters."

On Saturday, August 23rd, the Bay Area Community dedicated its monthly Community of Faith Breakfast to the memory of Father Moon. Rev. Thompson reported the following: "Dr. Mose Durst, former President of HSA-UWC USA, was the keynote speaker, and he shared deeply from his heart of how Father Moon is the most important person in his life and then explained why that is so. He shared some of the deep things Father Moon taught him in life and to focus on what is important and to not get caught up in things that are of far less significance. He also shared how Father Moon taught him about

being a person of heavenly dignity, always giving his best for God. Rev. Jasper Lowery then shared that he saw Father Moon as a man of deep prayer, and everything he did was bathed in prayer. Rev Lowery wondered how he was fortunate enough to have been able to meet Father Moon, and he concluded that it was because of his own prayer life."

The Sunday service at the Bay Area Family Church on August 25th was dedicated to testimonies of Father Moon from the congregation. After the service, there was a church picnic and games for kids. Many friends of the church were able to attend and celebrate.

Among the speakers were Columnist Mr. Mike Ghouse, who is a well-known guest on Sean Hannidy's radio and TV program; Imam Marzuq Jaami, who thanked Father Moon for his legacy and trust to carry on the work of building the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth; Dr. Harold Edwards, the second highest ranking bishop of America's 3rd largest African American denomination – Church of the Living God; And Larry Hornbeck, scientist and Emmy-award winning engineer and inventor, who shared how he went from doubt-ridden to absolutely certain that Rev. Moon is the one man we were all awaiting.
