Fast forward 11 years, and my view on faith has shifted from disdain and disbelief to a journey of exploration. My father's sudden passing was the most humbling moment of my life. Now, five years later, I have met an incredible, kind, and patient man of faith who has held my hand and helped guide me back.

What an amazing weekend. The retreat was short and to the point, and I've come to truly appreciate the teachings of the Unification movement. I am overwhelmed with a sense of love and belonging. Never in my life did I think my faith in God would be restored. I have seen, felt, and understood God's intention and heart in such a new way. I feel that I can finally relate to Him and let go of the suffering I have been through. This was always His plan. He has always been with me as a light in the darkness.
