Global Summit Ends with New Call for Peace on the Korean Peninsula



BUSINESS WIRE – The 2022 World Summit ended with a global summit and a proposal of practical recommendations for renewed efforts to unify the Korean Peninsula – the last split of the Cold War.

Саммит 11-13 февраля был проведен Федерацией за всеобщий мир и Королевским правительством Камбоджи. Сопредседателями Саммита выступили **премьер-министр Камбоджи Самдек Хун Сен** и Его Превосходительство **Пан Ги Мун**, бывший Генеральный секретарь Организации Объединенных Наций.

"Despite your difficult circumstances due to the coronavirus pandemic, I believe that you, our world leaders, with your commitment and dedication, will bring peace and unification to the Korean peninsula. Thank you," said Dr. **Hak Ja Han Moon**, co-founder Global Peace Federation (UPF) and host of the **World Summit 2022**.

The 11-13 February summit was hosted by the Global Peace Federation and the Royal Government of Cambodia. The Summit was co-chaired by **Cambodian Prime Minister Samdek Hun Sen** and His Excellency **Ban Ki-moon**, former Secretary-General of the United Nations.

One of Russia's largest news agencies, Interfax, has published, without edits, the official EUME press release about the World Summit 2022. Approximately two million subscribers will have seen this.

Activities in Moldova



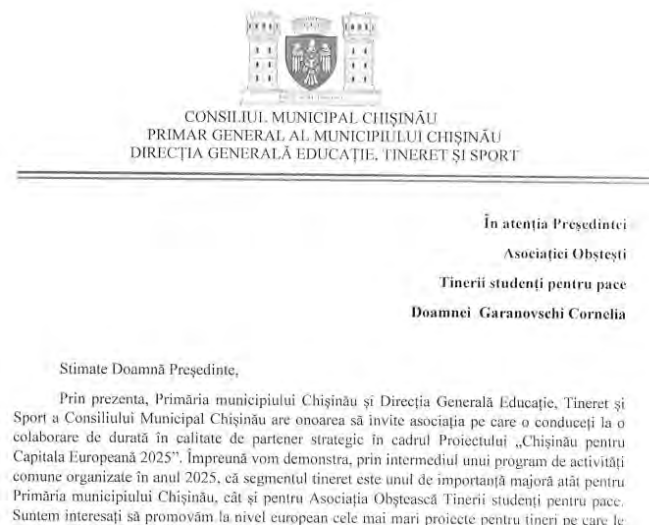
On 10 February the Family Federation team travelled to Gura Bîcului village in the Anenii Noi district to hold a meeting between Family Clubs of one village on the right side of the Dniester River and another one from the left side. Ten people gathered at the mayor's office, and another 11 parents joined by Zoom. It turned into a very heartistic and warm meeting. Andrei Esanu, FF president, guided the discussion. The event was fully hosted by the village mayor, Lilia Brehova, who attended throughout. That village already has hosted four Family Festivals.

Our movement in Poland graciously accepted a team of young members, who are continuing their online witnessing and outreach in the Warsaw Peace Embassy. A number of families moved to a safer part of Ukraine, close to the western border, living in very humble conditions but out of harm's way. In Kyiv, the capital, most members quickly moved into the main centre and to the national workshop site. Because of the bombing, members in the main centre are sleeping in the basement. Even in these emergency conditions, parents and children pray and bow to True Parents before going to sleep.
