On March 27, 2021, Shine City Project traveled to Summerlin to Angel Park for a service project with Get Outdoors Nevada! For the tree planting, park staff had already placed trees inside holes prior to the start of the service project. With the heavy-duty work already completed, all that was left to do was to help shovel dirt in the remaining gaps around the trees, as well as placing a nice, thick layer of mulch on top of everything. After that, we needed to create and ensure that there was a basin around the tree in order to help water from the

irrigation line be easily collected and reach down to the tree's roots. Though these were simple tasks, still we did our best to execute them with our hard work and dedication!

At the end of the service project, with the combined efforts of all the staff and volunteers who were present, both within and outside Shine City Project, 17 trees were planted! Additionally, 84 pounds of trash was collected from the park. Though our Shine City Project group was small and we helped to complete only a small fraction of what was accomplished overall, still we hope that our efforts made a big difference!
