Dr. Woo, a Korean forester and educator, received his Ph.D. in Forest Management from the Freibura University in Germany. He was awarded the DMZ Peace prize, the Society Service Grand Prize (educational sector) for educational excellence through his contribution to the realization of areen environment education. Currently, he serves as Professor Emeritus at Kangwon National University in South Korea.



Dr. Seung-ho Lee

Dr. Lee is President of The DM7 Forum, Inc., a **US-registered** non-profit organization that aims to transform the Korean DMZ into an International Peace Zone. He was Adjunct Professor and Senior Researcher at the New York University and graduated from the School of Public Service. He also worked for the New York State Legislative Commission on Critical Transportation Choices. He holds a Ph.D. degree in Political Science from the State University of New York at Albany.

Dr. Wu has been working as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow and Adjunct Assistant Professor at the Peace Research Center of National Quemoy University in Taiwan after getting a Ph.D. in Sociology at Seoul National University in South Korea. Her doctoral thesis explored how Kinmen island repositions in cross-strait relations and play a role in maintaining exchanges from the perspective of cross-strait tourism exchanges.
