A couple weeks ago, we identified several families bunkered down in Kiev that needed immediate financial support. We took up an offering and raised \$2,632 which was immediately wired to the affected families. 

As we watch the situation in Ukraine unfold, most things are still uncertain. However, as the invasion drags on, more and more damage is being done, and many families are losing their homes and livelihoods. Many of you have asked how Sergii's family is doing. They are currently out of the main warzone and are trying to leave the country. Very possibly, we may be receiving them here soon. We are also in touch with other families there, and depending on many factors, we may be receiving some other families in the near future.



We have asked our Ukrainian brother Eugene what we can do to help. Besides the prayer condition and donation campaigns, he has suggested petitions and appeals to local representatives that may be helpful.

A few brothers and sisters have decided to stay behind to protect the church properties in Kyiv and to resist. Two families are trapped in a town near Kyiv in the middle of the war zone.


