

When the world recognized the PRC as the sole government of one China in 1979, Beijing backed off the pressure on Taiwan. But that has fallen by the wayside and China has turned up the heat again. High-profile visits to Taiwan by U.S. leaders, some say, signal a hollowing out of the U.S. "one China" policy? Furthermore, China claims 90% of the South China Sea as historically theirs, including the world's busiest shipping lanes and the territorial waters of other nations. Increasingly, the region looks like a flashpoint in search of a spark.
