We received the amount of \$15,000 as your support to this institution. This enabled us to pay for the school-house-rent for two years (Jan. 2020 - Dec. 2021). We also built the new fence on this occasion which the government had suggested us to fix before, bought the new 50 chairs and desks, and repaired the school partially and prepared some pieces of equipment for the school reopening. For the year of 2019, we had 112 students in total: 45 babies and children at day-care center and kindergarten, and 67 elementary students.
