now be **exploring what it takes to overcome the challenges leading up to a Korean reunification in substance, and possible obstacles to prepare for afterward.**

This program will be a platform to further unification efforts, through spreading awareness, listening to personal stories and experiences, and to discuss practical pointers to make reunification possible. **If you have yet to register for this significant program, now is the time to do so!**

Preview the Speaker's Topics:

Our first panelist, **Ryu Youn Kwon**, is the President of the KuenSaem After-School Class.

During her presentation, Ms. Kwon will recount her heart-wrenching family story, experiencing economic hardship and political punishments living in North Korea. Having fled to China in 1997, and eventually arriving in South Korea in 2001, she was pained by the bullying her children experienced as defectors in South Korea. Ms. Kwon will be sharing her story overcoming these challenges, and how it fueled her desire to serve North Korean refugees, and to be a force for unification.

Koji Iida is the Representative Director of the NPO Uri Hana, and a boxing coach of Choson University.

After learning about the Japanese colonial rule during a trip to Korea, Mr. Iida was deeply pained by his Japanese history of domination. Since that time, he has devoted his life to the issues of reconciliation through his professional boxing, adoption into a Korean family, and NPO work to build bridges between Japanese and Korean people. He will share about his trials and life experiences, and encourage those involved in the Korean War to do their part to resolve the separations that remain to this day.

Teson Chon is a graduate of a Choson school and is a third generation North Korean living in Japan.

He will present about the origin of Choson schools, established by those who fled from Korea during the Japanese occupation before the division, and the unique identity of their descendants who seek their ancestors' unified homeland.

The final panelist, **Dr. rer. pol. Beatrice Bischof**, is a member of the managing board of the Foreign Affairs Association in Munich. She attended to the Ludwig-Maximilians-University at Munich. Then she completed her studies focused on political sciences, constitutional law and literature sciences and graduated as Dr. rer. pol. with the additional focus on economic and social history. Until 1996 she was member of the managing board of the company of her family. Then she finished an education as TV journalist at the Kirch Media Group. Since that time she has been working as a TV journalist, political scientist, consultant and author.

Dr. Bischof will share about the challenges and supporting factors involved in the reunification of East and West Germany, as an example of what to expect and prepare for on the Korean Peninsula. She will describe the importance of nation-building to bring two diverse systems into one, the supportive events and individuals that helped grow a unified national identity, the economic and political challenges after unification, and the anchoring involvement of the wider European region. In addition, Dr. Bischof will share possible activities to develop personal bonds across the Korean Peninsula.
