PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Dear Ladies, Friends, and Families,

Looking back on this year 2016, which is coming quickly to a close, we are grateful for the many successes and new developments we were able to accomplish together! Please take a moment to look at the highlights summary below.

This last year truly was a challenging and "transitional" year on many levels-maybe also in your own life and in your own families-as the entire globe seems to be in confusion, shaken up by terrorism, the thousands of displaced refugees, political strife, and wars.

Without going into further detail and listing more terrible trends and events, it is now that we need to hear other voices, voices of goodness, peace, and encouragement.

And as we look into 2017, we are hopeful that there are indeed many "voices for peace" in the world, such as Pope Francis, who in his annual "Urbi et Orbi" Christmas address called for peace when he said that "... the yearning for peace should be stronger than that for war... weapons need to be stilled forever... the international community actively seeks solutions to restore peace and civility" in all war-torn countries and among people who are suffering. Also, Queen Elizabeth II, in her annual Christmas address, gave words of hope and consolation, saying, "I often draw strength from meeting ordinary people doing extraordinary things: volunteers, carers, community organizers, and good neighbors; unsung heroes whose quiet dedication makes them special.

"They are," she continued, "an inspiration to those who know them, and their lives frequently embody a truth expressed by Mother Teresa. She once said, 'Not all of us can do great things. Another "voice for peace," WFWP International co-founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, initiated the International Association of Parliamentarians for Peace this past month. With the aim of making peace a reality in the coming years, she convened a special inaugural gathering of this organization in the nation's capital on November 29. In her speech on Capitol Hill, she called on the assembled legislators from around the world, including current members of the U.S. Congress, to be role models of goodness and peace. Dr. Moon called for a cooperative spirit among all political leaders to address the serious global issues at hand, which, she said, cannot be solved by one person, organization, or country alone but only with the assistance of the Creator and the good collaboration among leaders who take a sincere interest in the people they are responsible for.

WFWP USA is inspired by these examples and is determined to redouble our



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resolve and efforts in 2017 to not only be a voice of goodness and peace in the midst of all the troubles, but also to continue to practice "Leadership of the Heart" (see the speech by Aimmee Kodachian, a panelist in the 2016 WFWP assembly) and "Be the Standard of Goodness" (the speech by Aneta ThinkofAll, another assembly panelist).

We are counting on your continued support and involvement in 2017, which we dedicate as a "Year of Actions for Goodness" rather than just words.

WFWP 2016 In Review: Giving Back to the Community

Women's Federation for World Peace USA (WFWP) has had an eventful 2016, filled with upliftment, action, leadership, and the strengthening of bonds and relationships, all in the pursuit of peace. Notable



highlights from this year include the development of our **educational programs**; **service and relief work** both locally and abroad; and **reconciliation** through the Bridge of Peace Ceremony.

1. Education:

Our theme for 2016 has been "Compassionate, Sustainable Leadership." As a community of women, we are passionate about raising authentic, compassionate, and conscientious leaders who practice what we call "Leadership of the Heart."

To accomplish this, we are developing a Leadership of the Heart educational three-part series; and have featured the first seminar, "Finding the Leader Within," in several states including during our leadership retreat in Tampa this past July. This series highlights the importance of leading by example, and provides insights on the importance of women initiating positive change in their own lives, in their families, communities, and beyond.

This year, WFWP has hosted 14 leadership and women empowerment activities and eight Family Life education seminars, for a total of 22 empowering programs.

CHI-CHI'S SONG



"When I was about seven years old, I chanced upon a photo album hidden under the 'good' linen and placemats we never used. I

looked at the Model T cars, the fashions of the 30s, the quaint old ladies and little

children spruced up for the occasion of a family photograph. Then I looked at other faces: chiseled faces, faces with eyes that bored into mine and awakened at once fear and familiarity. Who were these people?" When I enquired, I was told only, "They're family!"...(and) the albums disappeared, destroyed by overzealous relatives anxious to expunge painful family memories."

So read the first lines of my second book, **Chi-Chi's Song**, a NaNoWriMo (National Novel Writing Month), project I completed in 2013, after participating in a walk sponsored by WFWP in June-July of 2013. Nine of us set out from New Echota, Georgia to Tallequah, Oklahoma to experience the Trail of Tears, the long march of the Five Nations People (Seminoles, Cherokee, Muskogee-Creek, Choctaw, and Chickasaw tribes). These tribes were removed from their lands and forced to walk west during one of the bitterest winters on record. Without adequate food, clothing, or shelter, thousands of them, perhaps as many as one in every four people that set out, died along the bitter path. Hundreds more perished even before the journey began, succumbing to one of the



hottest summers that area had experienced, as well as to disease, hunger and other maladies.

Heartfelt Gratitude from Rwanda: 2016 Report from New Hope Technical Institute

Have you recently attended a WFWP USA Schools of Africa benefit? Perhaps you've joined one of our local chapters in an evening of music, food, and stories from Africa. Perhaps you were even moved to donate to this worthy cause. This year, your donations went toward a total of \$5,000 which was sent to the New Hope Technical Institute in Kigali, Rwanda. The money went toward much needed equipment and materials for the school's courses in culinary arts and dressmaking. The school was also able to purchase several fire extinguishers and fans for the classrooms.

The New Hope Technical Institute currently has 117 students, 41 students enrolled in culinary arts, 38 in dressmaking, and 38 pursuing hairdressing/beautician courses. Many of these students also face economic hardships, which makes attending the courses difficult. Thus, the school supported 55 students this year with scholarships.
