WFWP hosts former US Ambassador of Religious Freedom Suzan Johnson Cook

Just before True Mother delivered her speech, "Peace Starts With Me," 120 women of every background, culture, and religion as well as several supporting gentlemen gathered in the Crystal Ballroom of the New Yorker Hotel on the morning of July 15 to hear a message from former Ambassador at Large of International Religious Freedom under former President Barack Obama, Suzan Johnson Cook.

Women leaders and friends pouring in were received with a delicious breakfast, and the spirit was high even before Ambassador Johnson Cook arrived. Emcee Katarina Connery, Women's Federation for World Peace (WFWP) USA Vice President, introduced WFWP USA President Angelika Selle who welcomed the gathering and explained about the miracles preceding and surrounding the coming event at Madison Square Garden.

In her own, powerful, spirit filled and practical way, she then shared many practical pointers of how women can accomplish peace within, addressing women of all faiths in the room. She mentioned about the Biblical word of "Selah" which means pause in the context of singing or playing music. Women and mothers most of all need to take a Selah, a pause in their lives to regroup and re-energize, to connect with God and to honor their own space.



Ambassador Johnson Cook involved the participation of the audience every step of the way, pouring out nuggets of wisdom based on her books and own life experience, uplifting the men and women in the room. "This was not only for you women, but also a message for me personally," said a gentleman in the audience.

Ambassador Johnson Cook "outdid" herself according to Rev. Juanita, who had heard her speak and attend workshops on many occasions. Some of her topics speak directly to the heart and soul of women: "Too Blessed to be Stressed", "Soul Sisters", and "Becoming A Woman of Destiny"

One young woman leader during the Q and A session after her speech asked how Ambassador Johnson Cook made it to the position, and in a short but powerful way, she explained the many "God – moments" that lead from one connection she was able to make to another, and that any woman in the room can do the same.

Emcee, Katarina Connnery, then invited the audience to join the festival with Mother Moon at the Garden, and asked the ladies to consider "paying forward" what they received by giving a donation to a School Project in Nepal.
