It's going to feature Ambassadors for Peace and True Family Values Lectures. We'll also have a guest speaker, our old friend, Senator Mike Gabbard. Our trinities to work together and invite people together for mobilization.

hard to meet once a week. They use Zoom to meet, since it can be tough to meet in person. I hope that following the We Can Do It workshop and the format of this event and the trinity-led follow-up programs, people will start to think about how they can take initiative.
