True Parents' Birthday Celebrations In America



From January 27 -- 29, local communities in all 5 subregions in America celebrated True Parents' birthdays with large events and small intimate gatherings. In Subregion 1, 502 members and guests from New Jersey gathered to observe the holy day complete with an offering table, performances, and a presentation on the goals and mission for 2023. In Connecticut, 100 members held a Pledge Service followed by lunch and a Yute Game. Smaller gatherings were held in Manhattan, at Belvedere, in Massachusetts and in the Hudson Valley.

In Subregion 2, more than 200 members gathered at the Capital Family Church in Washington, D.C. for a birthday dinner celebration where together, they viewed True Mother's new year's message and heard Dr. Michael Jenkins' personal testimony about True Mother. Smaller gatherings were held in Georgia, North and South Carolina, in Orlando, Miami and in Jacksonville Florida, and in Virginia. Many of the celebrations happened online as well as in person.

In Subregion 3, 100 members and guests gathered at the Minnesota Family Church and 180 celebrated at the Chicago Family Church with a pledge service and food.

In Ohio, 97 members and guests offered kyung-baes as part of their celebrations, and 37 members gathered in Indianapolis to honor True Parent's birthday.

In Subregion 4, members gathered locally at each other's homes or at the local churches in Louisiana, Arkansas, Arizona, Alabama and Texas. Their celebrations were small and intimate.

In Subregion 5, members gathered at the Bay Area Family Church for a 7 A.M. observance of True Parents' birthday and had fellowship, prayer, and breakfast.

Families also gathered in more intimate settings in San Diego and in Washington state where they played Yute.
