## Barrytown Youth and Young Adult Ministry's bonding trip to Six Flags

Inspired by this event, the YAYAM participants separated into three small groups to bond and share stories with other Great Escape visitors, and then regroup and share their experiences with one another. Some of the groups met with Christian ministers who answered various questions and discussed important points about God. This small activity had everyone feeling happy and connected.

After a day of enjoying, bonding and even conquering a fear of heights, the group gathered around the carousel to share their day's testimonies and ended in a closing prayer. One participant mentioned in his prayer a feeling of unity at the day's end.
