

#### LOGO USAGE

The Children's Ministry logos should be used thoughtfully and consistently. Most often the full color vertical logo will be used but the dark gray and white versions can be used in instances where color is unavailable (a black and white printer, for example), or on a background color where the colors of the full color logo would get lost.

DO:



Preferred background colors for the full color logo are white, light gray (#ebeaea), and dark gray (#3c3531).



Do not use the logo in a way that it becomes hard to see.



Be sure to leave adequate spacing around the logo: leave a space that is at least the width of the logo's sun.

Avoid the following: drop-shadows, changing dimensions (stretching), rotating, busy backgrounds, and cutting off parts of the logo.

#### CREATION OF NEW LOGOS

When customizing the logo with your city's or church's name, be sure to keep the overall weights and proportions of the existing logo. For example, the work "Gather" is much shorter than "Family Fed," so a larger font size is required. The width of the logos does not need to stay the same, but the visual weight needs to stay consistent.

Do not use a font size larger than what is shown in the diagram below. Consider using two lines if the text is very long. Do not change the "Children's Ministry" font size.



If the city or church's name has no descenders, be sure to move the "Children's Ministry" text up slightly. If the first letter of the new logo has a descender and there are no others that would be in the way, consider tucking the "Children's Ministry" text under and slightly to the right of the main text, rather than centering it. In all other instances, the "Children's Ministry" text must be centered.

Be sure to keep all colors consistent with existing logo.



Primary font is Leckerli-One. Available at font-squirrel.com

Secondary font is Verlag Black. Available at freefontsfamily.com. Avoid using Verlag font online without crediting the author. More detailed information available in the font license, where the font is downloaded.
