Albania

Austria

Romania

and many wanted to stay all night! Young adult CIG participant Natalia Tadin, shared her experience of guest care:

"This week, I was able to meet up with Sara three times with our country leader, Joshua. We went up to 'The Fall' lecture with her. I'm really grateful to God for bringing this sister to CARP.
