IAED USA Webinar: An Answer to America's Homeless Crisis

Dear,

According to the <u>Annual Homelessness Assessment Report</u>, there are 650,000 people (the size of the city of Boston) who experienced homelessness on at least one night in 2022. Chronic homelessness has increased nearly 30% between 2020 and 2023, estimated at 143,100 people. The majority of these were unsheltered, meaning they are sleeping in tents, on streets, in cars, in public parks or other places not meant for human habitation. In California, the state put aside \$7.2 billion to address homelessness in the 2021-22 state budget, which equates to spending nearly \$42,000 per homeless person. This is a catastrophe of human suffering and economic destruction in our largest cities. Will more money fix the problem? What is the moral solution to help the homeless without ceding the down-towns, tourist attractions and residential neighborhoods of our cities to homeless encampments?

George Mullen is leading an initiative in San Diego California called <u>Sunbreak Ranch Homeless Triage Center</u>. With strong support of the business community and local philanthropy, <u>Sunbreak Ranch has a plan</u> to create a community where 5,000 homeless can be given temporary shelter to assist them with mental health issues, drug addiction and job training among other services. It is a ready-to-go pilot project that can be replicated anywhere among the largest cities.


