The program is developed with international creative producer and educator, Ajay Rai, as lead tutor and creative director.

The CREATE – Filmmaking Workshop is aimed at aspiring filmmakers aged 18–35. This initiative supports young emerging talent to take their story ideas from script to screen. Up to 12 successful applicants are guided to develop their original ideas and to pitch their projects to a prospective client/commissioner. The workshop includes a 2-day seminar focusing on storytelling, and a 3-day course focusing on production, including videography for events.

We'll provide hands-on training, mentorship and industry exposure, with professional guidance provided at every stage. During several months, you will also receive guidance and feedback from industry professionals to turn your idea into a short film script or treatment.

In addition we will discuss an actual project brief to produce a short film for the FFWPU EUME. You will be invited to develop and submit your ideas and have the chance to pitch directly to the NGO. I'm currently a student, can I apply?

Yes. The Creative Industries can be tough and this workshop intends to be equally informative and empowering to jump start your careers.

I'm currently younger/older than 18/35, can I apply?

If you are younger than 18, then you will need to have local parent or chaperone supervision. We cannot take responsibility for you outside of the classroom. If you are older than 35 then we will be open to your participation on a case by case basis. It is the combined chemistry and dynamic of the group that will be of most importance to us.

Do I need to have attached cast or crew members to my project?

We do not expect you to have secured cast or crew. However if there are some cast and crew you'd like to work with, please indicate on the application form.

How much does it cost to participate?

Participation fee is 200€
