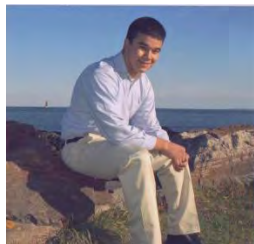


Passing of Wonsung Mark Fairbrother

In his 2008 High School class yearbook, Mark conveyed his philosophy with a quote from Tupac Shakur which stated: "Even when the road is hard, never give up." When Mark set his mind to do something he would persevere until the end.
