
CARP Webinar: Intentional Unificationist Communities Across America

Many students and parents are concerned about having a spiritual environment of support after finishing high school or a gap year program, especially as students move away from home to attend university. For students seeking a community to connect to as they transition into college, professional life, and so on, there are several options across the country. As a response to students' inquiries of "What's out there for me?," the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP) America reached out to some known "intentional" communities to discover how they operate and the resources that they offer.
