Requirements

We are seeking highly motivated **current college students or recent graduates** who are excited about the vision for CARP and who want to contribute to expanding its reach among campuses across the country.

Interns should have excellent verbal and written communication skills, with working knowledge of Web, social media, and Microsoft Suite programs including Word, Excel, and PowerPoint.

Interns should have a broad foundational knowledge of and interest in sociology, philosophy, and political science. They should be familiar with the six CARP Curriculum topics that have already been developed and with the worldview of CARP and CARP's founders.

Time Requirement

The internship will last for 17 weeks, from March 1st to June 30th. Interns are expected to contribute 3 hours per week on average, including a weekly conference call with the entire Curriculum Development team. Other time will be spent conducting research on the topics being developed, contributing ideas to the team, and giving feedback on content other team members develop. All communications will be conducted virtually. Interns are invited to conduct further research according to their level of interest in the topic being developed.

Interns will be provided a stipend of \$500 upon successful completion of the internship.
