

CAMP SUNRISE ON THE RISE

One invaluable asset of our community is the close location of rustic, beautiful Camp Sunrise. Every summer for almost twenty years, youth from all over the country, but especially New York, have deepened their peer bonds and understanding of God while living in nature. This is only possible because of this wonderful facility and the many hard working and dedicated adults, such as Debbie Grodner, Brian Sabourin, Valentina Mikhailenko and Larry Benaloga as well as the talented young adult summer counselors and grounds staff. In addition, over the years many of us can remember many memorable Sunday services, workshops, retreats and family campouts at this glorious natural setting.

However, as we all know, the camp, just as much as the church, is also a business with fiscal responsibilities. Unfortunately, over the recent years, partly due to a decrease in demographics, Camp Sunrise has come up with fiscal short falls. This summer was no exception due to some sudden cancellations from outside organization who normally bring in substantial revenue. According to the camp contract, WestRock, NY district, NJ, and CT have had to provide certain percentages of the deficit in order to keep the camp running. This has happened again this year. For a while there the council was pulling our hair out with what to do. But luckily this year headquarters was able to make a huge difference by forgiving \$10,000 of this year's overall camp debt. What also helped was what WestRock earned during our Sunday Services at Sunrise. So thank you for participating generously at our Camp Sunrise Services! We still had to contribute \$808 to cover the deficit but overall we were fortunate for the reduction this year.

But we don't like to run on luck! This autumn the council felt compelled to help remedy the situation more permanently with the goal to make Sunrise support itself. Over the months WestRock council members held discussions and several meetings with regional representatives and board members to analyze the problems and solutions. We especially want to thank from WestRock, Noah Ross who was been investing much of his time for many years for the sake of our camp and Kester Wilkening who jumped in to help address the recent situation. One result from these recent meetings was a new contract drawn up with the camp, in which WestRock, NY district and NJ agreed to share the burden of any shortfall in the Sunrise budget. The commitment of financial backing has been made as follows: WestRock 40%, the NY district 30% and NJ 30%. Both Connecticut and headquarters will no longer be able to commit to filling in for any camp deficit, so this is a concern.

Another result from these meetings was the formation of a new board composed: Alexander Beebe and Manoj Jacob from the NJ, John Kung and Clementine Galvan from the NY district and Kenshin Furuta and Danso Sawamukai from WestRock. We are grateful for this team stepping up to the plate and ask everyone to

support them. We also look forward to bringing in the opinions of Emily Zochol Kise and Matt Kise, who have done a fabulous job of running the camp activities for the past few years. With the new energy and ideas with this business minded yet spiritually centered group of board members we feel confidence that Camp Sunrise is on the rise.

One new step forward is the hiring of a Business Director with a clear job description that includes bringing in new revenue with more clients, controlling expenditures and providing monthly and annual financial reports. Working alongside the board, the Business Director will be able to focus on building up and improving the camp functioning in order to create a steady and increased income and self-sustainability.

This is a fabulous facility with clear potential to accommodate more activity and bring in more income. We have every reason to believe the camp will be more productive than ever before. You can help by spreading the word with other organizations that might be interested in renting our facilities. It also helps if you and your family use our camp yourself such as with a family "stay-cation" or maybe a small group getaway. This fall the Council found Sunrise to be a perfect place for a retreat. Also keep in mind that in the spring a good turnout for the camp re-opening work-party makes a big difference and is much more fun. *article by Lynn Walsh*
