In the midst of the Peace Road 2020: Reconciling All People tour around the United

States, the Family Church of New York City (FCNYC) celebrated two holy days, the 30th Declaration Day of God's Eternal Blessing (Chil II Jeol) and the 24th Declaration of the Realm of the Cosmic Sabbath for the Parents of Heaven and Earth (Chil Pal Jeol), on August 19 through a live <u>Facebook broadcast</u>.
