

60 attend Tribal Messiahship 'We Can Do It' Sampler Workshop in Miami, FL

Simone Miyazaki, Pastor of the Miami Family Church, invited FFWPU USA Director of Evangelism Demian Dunkley and his family to co-host a half-day 'We Can Do It' sampler seminar on June 26, 2016. Sixty people attended, including 15 young adult Unificationists.

Participants were guided through self-reflection and discussion designed to introduce them to the concept of trinity-centric tribal messiahship. They also were led through a goal setting activity in order to create actionable, measurable goals, including an immediate goal that they then were asked to complete in the next five minutes.
