The Universal Peace Federation (UPF) holds its virtual Second Rally of Hope

The Universal Peace Federation (UPF) concluded its second Rally of Hope on Sunday, Sept. 27, 2020. The 3-hour event, held in Korea and broadcast online to the world, hosted 12 distinguished world leaders, along with first-class entertainment. According to the Chairman of the Organizing Committee, Mr. Yun Young-ho, two million people from 194 nations were given tickets to watch online, while millions of other viewers observed the Rally via various broadcast providers and internet platforms.

On Sunday afternoon, at 16:00 Central European Time, a special broadcast of the Rally of Hope's Highlights was organized by UPF Europe & Middle East for those in the Region who were not able to watch live the Korean event during the night.

The theme of the Rally focused on realizing a world of peace through interdependence, mutual prosperity, and universal values. The gathering served as a wake-up call to national and world leaders that the well-being of humankind and the destiny our planet rests in the hands of responsible leaders.


Peace messages and prayers were given by:



The Right Reverend Munib A. Younan, Bishop Emeritus of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land, 2020 Sunhak Peace Prize Laureate

Bishop Emeritus Younan is the former President (2010-2017) of the Lutheran World Federation, a global communion of Christian churches with 148 member churches in 99 countries representing more than 75.5 million Christians. He is past president of the Fellowship of the Middle East Evangelical Churches and provides leadership for the ecumenical Patriarchs and Heads of Local Christian Churches in Jerusalem, as well as for the

Council of Religious Institutions in the Holy Land, comprised of leaders of Jerusalem's Jewish, Muslim and Christian communities.



His Eminence Kelvin Edward Felix, Cardinal, Archbishop emeritus of Castries

His Eminence Kelvin Felix is the Roman Catholic Archbishop emeritus of Castries, the capital of the Caribbean island nation of St. Lucia. Born in Dominica and ordained a priest, he graduated from St. Francis Xavier University in Nova Scotia, the University of Notre Dame in USA and the University of Bradford in England. He served as the Principal of the Roman Catholic High School in Dominica and Associate General Secretary of the Caribbean Conference of Churches. He was consecrated archbishop in 1981

and as cardinal in 2014. Since his retirement, he has returned to his native Dominica, where he assists in smaller parishes.

Dr. Thomas Walsh, Chairman, UPF International

Dr. Walsh is the Chairman of UPF International, Secretary General of the Sunhak Peace Prize Foundation and President of the World Peace Road Foundation. He has been a teacher, author, and editor specializing in the areas of interfaith, religious studies, peace studies, philosophy, and social theory. Dr. Walsh serves on the International Council of the World Association of Non-Governmental Organizations and the International Coalition for Religious Freedom. He has contributed to and edited more than 30 books related to interfaith, peacebuilding and renewal of the United

Nations. He is also the President of the World Peace Road Foundation.



H.E. Goodluck Jonathan, President (2010-2015) Nigeria

President Goodluck Jonathan is a renowned Nigerian politician who served as Vice President of the country from 2007 to 2010, and as President from 2010 to 2015. During his tenure as President, he worked tirelessly to strengthen the capacity of ECOWAS to respond to several challenges and personally led efforts that resolved the political crises in Côte d'Ivoire, Niger, Guinea Bissau, Mali, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Benin and Togo. He founded the Goodluck Jonathan Foundation (GJF) with a vision to strengthening democratic governance, consolidating peace and stability as

well as promoting prosperity through youth empowerment in Africa. He is currently the Chair of the International Summit Council for Peace (ISCP).

Congratulatory remarks were offered by the Co-Chairs of the International Association of Parliamentarians for Peace:



Hon. Dan Burton, Member of Congress, USA (1983-2013); and International Co-Chairman, International Association of Parliamentarians for Peace (IAPP)

Hon. Dan Burton served in the U.S. House of Representatives (1983-2013). During his time in Congress, he served as either Chairman or Ranking Member of the subcommittees on, Asia and Pacific, Middle East, Europe and Eurasia, Africa and Western Hemisphere as well as Chairman of the Government Reform and Oversight Committee. Currently he is Co-Chairman of the International Association of Parliamentarians for Peace.



Hon. Jose de Venecia, Jr., Speaker, House of Representatives (1992-1998), (2001-2008), Philippines

Hon. Jose de Venecia is Co-Chair of International Association of Parliamentarians for Peace; and Chairman-Emeritus of Universal Peace Federation. Hon. Jose de Venecia was elected five-times as Speaker of the House of Representatives. He is the Founding Chairman and Chairman of Standing Committee of the International Conference of Asian Political Parties, composed of more than 350 ruling and opposition parties from 52 countries in Asia.

Before the Founder's speech, the program featured three Keynote Speakers:



H.E. José Manuel Barroso, *Prime Minister of Portugal (2002-2004)*, *President of the European Commission (2004-2014)*.

Jose Manuel Barroso enjoyed a successful and varied academic career embracing law, European Studies, Political and Social Sciences and became Assistant Professor of Law at Lisbon University and later Director of the Department for International Relations at Lisbon's Lusiada University. In the 1980s he rose through the Portuguese Foreign Ministry to become (in 1992) Minister of Foreign Affairs for 3 years before entering Parliament and in 1999 becoming the leader of his political party and de facto Leader of the

Opposition. In 2002, Barroso became Prime Minister. 2 years later he was appointed as President of the European Commission, in which post he served for 10 years, until 2014. He is currently Chairman of Goldman Sachs International and teaches at various American and European universities on issues related to the EU, international business and international affairs.



Hon. Richard (Dick) Cheney, 46th Vice President of the United States (2001-2009)

Hon. Richard (Dick) Cheney served as Vice President in the administration of President George W. Bush; previously he was Secretary of Defense (1989-93) in the administration of President George H.W. Bush. He studied at Yale University and earned bachelor's (1965) and master's (1966) degrees in political science from the University of Wyoming and was a doctoral candidate at the University of Wisconsin. He worked in the administration of President Richard Nixon and became a deputy assistant to

President Gerald Ford in 1974 and his chief of staff from 1975 to 1977. In 1978 he was elected from Wyoming to the first of six terms in the United States House of Representatives.



H.E. Evaristo Carvalho, President, Republic of São Tomé and Príncipe

H.E. Evaristo Carvalho has been President of São Tomé and Príncipe since 2016. He was previously the Prime Minister of the Central African island country on two occasions (1994 and 2001- 2002). As president, H.E. Carvalho has been diligent in fighting poverty which affects two thirds of the population. The U.S. Department of State praised the election of President Carvalho stating that "This election is a yet another demonstration of Sao Tome and Principe's long-standing commitment to democratic values. Through their exemplary conduct, the people of Sao Tome and

Principe continue to serve as a beacon of democracy for other countries." In 2019, UPF-Co-Founder, Dr Hak Ja Han Moon, addressed an international summit in São Tomé hosted by President H.E. Carvalho.

After UPF Founder Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon gave her Founder's Address, some musical entertainment was performed by the well-known Korean artist Kim Myung-Gon, Minister of Culture and Tourism (2006 - 2007).


H.E. Dan Quayle, 44th Vice-President of the United States (1989-1993)

Hon. Dan Quayle was the 44th Vice President of the United States of America to President George H. W. Bush from 1989 through 1993. Previously he served in the U.S. Congress as a representative and senator from the state of Indiana. He is the author of three books, including Standing Firm: A Vice-Presidential Memoir, which was on The New York Times' Best Seller List for 15 weeks. He was a distinguished visiting professor at Arizona State University's Thunderbird School of Global Management for two years. Currently, he is the Chairman of Cerberus Global Investments,



Hon. Heng Samrin, President of the National Assembly of Cambodia

H.E. Samdech Heng Samrin, President of the National Assembly of Cambodia since 2006. A member of Parliament since 1993, he previously served as General Secretary of the Kampuchean People's Revolutionary Party and Chairman of the People's Revolutionary Council.



H.E. Syed Yusuf Raza Gilani, 18th Prime Minister of Pakistan (2008-2012)

H.E. Syed Yousaf Raza Gillani served as the 18th Prime Minister of Pakistan from 2008 to 2012. He is the first and, thus far, the only prime minister that holds the distinction of successfully presenting five consecutive federal budgets. He previously served as Minister of Tourism and Minister of Housing and Work Force. Mr. Gilani also served as the 15th Speaker of the National Assembly, a post he held from 1993 to 1997. As Prime minister, he formed the Truth and Reconciliation Commission,

rehabilitated the troubled and war-torn tribal belt, and made great efforts to reduce the federal budget deficit, as well as to improve the system of education. He currently serves as the vice-chairman of the central executive committee of the Pakistan People's Party.

The Rally of Hope's Highlights program, broadcast on Sunday afternoon for the Europe & Middle East audience, featured a Muslim Prayer for Peace given by Mrs. Asmaa Kftarou, from the Women's Advisory Board and a UN Special Envoy to Syria.



Mrs. Asmaa Kftarou, Women's Advisory Board, UN Special Envoy, Syria

A native of Syria, Asmaa Kftaro is actively involved in interfaith work. She is working with the UN as a consultant on Gender Equality with a specific focus on the empowerment of Syrian women after the war. She has a Bachelor's degree in Islamic studies from the Daawa college in Damascus (2004). She established the Syrian Islamic Forum to work in civil society for women's and children's rights, the empowerment of women and the promotion of the language of dialogue and peace in Damascus. She is the granddaughter of Sheikh Ahmad Kftaro, the late grand Mufti of Syria. She is

living in the UAE.

Moving forward, these rallies will be conducted monthly throughout the remainder of this year. Each event will focus on a specific group of leaders: parliamentarians, academicians, entrepreneurs, media persons and religious leaders.

UPF plans to continue organizing the "Rally of Hope" world-level virtual events, which bring thousands of world leaders and concerned citizens from around the globe together in search for the "Realization of a Heavenly Unified World."

Following are summaries of the Keynote Speeches given during the Rally of Hope.



Hon. Jose Manuel Barroso, former *President of the European Commission (2004–2014), spoke of the c*onflicts and global environmental and economic problems that continue to present themselves in the 21st Century. He emphasized the importance to commit to international cooperation and multilateralism. Climate change, trade issues, and global pandemics all require an international response, he said. The vocabulary we use to talk about these issues—calling them "threats" that have the potential to cause "extinction"—is unnecessarily pessimistic. It is necessary to convince the world that these problems can be solved, and that cooperation can be productive and reliable. We must convince the world that hope is stronger than fear, he concluded.



H.E. Richard Cheney, former *Vice President of the United States of America (2001–2009)*, was the next keynote speaker. He congratulated the Universal Peace Federation for its illustrious collection of speakers. COVID-19 has constituted a great test of global leadership and cooperation, he said. While the rules-based system of good-faith dealing is vital, it is also necessary to recognize that not every regime will operate in good faith and follow the rules of international order. Credibility is one of a country's most vital resources; to participate in good faith, countries must follow through on their commitments and stated ideals.



H.E. Evaristo Carvalho, *President of Sao Tome and Principe, was the third keynote speaker.* He named climate change, armed conflicts, and COVID-19 as major challenges to nations and international organizations today. He reiterated the importance of learning to live alongside one-another and overcome national and religious conflicts. He emphasized the importance of education in the process of achieving peace, prosperity, and cooperation. This education must affirm the dignity and value of each human being. The family is a key point at which education occurs. Through our interactions with our family, we learn how to interact with our community and the world. Peace, prosperity, and happiness will be a reality in the near future if we can achieve positive cooperation.



Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon, *Co-Founder of the Universal Peace Federation,* delivered the Founder's Address. She recognized the Korean Thanksgiving holiday, Chuseok, coming later this week. The COVID-19 crisis shows humanity's fundamental frailty, both our physical vulnerability and the vulnerability caused by our failure to cooperate with and tolerate one-another. We are dependent on our environment, yet through pollution and exploitation we are destroying it. We must let go of self-centeredness and greed and resist the temptation to divide ourselves from our fellow humans. She addressed the government and people of China, expressing hope that modern technology might someday transform the Gobi Desert into a verdant forest, proving it possible to reverse desertification. If the resources that countries pour into weapons were instead used for social,


environmental, and technological investments, much could be accomplished. A nation's blessings are not for the enjoyment of that nation alone. Due to climate change, the livable parts of the earth are shrinking. Dr. Moon called on us all to let go of selfishness, embrace our status as children of God, and begin efforts to repair the damage our species has caused to the environment.



H.E. Dan Quayle, former *Vice President of the United States of America* (1989–1993), spoke next. He praised *The Washington Times* for its continuing commitment to truthful, values-oriented journalism. He praised UPF's commitment to universal values. The message that we are One Family Under God is key to understanding how to move towards peace. The Cold War ended, during H.E. Quayle's tenure as Vice President, due to an international commitment to freedom and a peaceful resolution to the problem. Similarly, the ongoing division on the Korean Peninsula can be resolved peacefully for the security and prosperity of all. He called on the audience to build a new movement for peace, aligned with the ideals of our Creator.



Hon. Heng Samrin, *President of the National Assembly of Cambodia*, was the next keynote speaker. He commended UPF Co-founder Dr. Moon for providing this forum for politicians, religious leaders, and civil society members to discuss solutions to global challenges. Cambodia has responded effectively to the COVID-19 crisis and managed to control the disease without a single death, he said. The role of parliaments is increased in times of crisis, and the present crisis is no exception. Parliaments need to plan for the arduous recovery process, recognizing many possibilities for how this recovery will play out, and for the re-ignition of global trade and travel. He concluded by wishing for all present a blessing of prosperity and health.



H.E. Syed Yusuf Raza Gilani, *Prime Minister of Pakistan (2008–2014), gave t*he last keynote address. This is a critical point in history, he said, and the lessons we take from this experience will shape the coming century. Himself a survivor of the novel coronavirus, he called his battle with the disease, a battle which so many have lost, a humbling experience, and said that the crisis presents the opportunity for us to realize the common bonds of our humanity. He spoke with pride of Pakistan's response to the health and economic crisis, and of the bravery and sacrifice of his country's doctors and nurses. He called for debt restructuring for small countries that have needed to take loans for pandemic response. He urged that the COVID-19 vaccine, when available, be provided for free.

Ms. Srruthi Lekha Raaja Elango, UN representative, WFWP Geneva, India

Ms. Srruthi Lekha Raaja Elango holds a B.A. in Economics, Political Science & Sociology from Christ University, Bangalore, India, and a B.A. in International Relations from Rhine - Waal University of Applied Sciences, Kleve, Germany. She is currently an intern for the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC), Geneva, Switzerland, representing the Women's Federation for World Peace (WFWP). She has extensive experience with humanitarian and peace projects focusing on women's empowerment.



Rt. Hon. Baroness Sandip Verma, Member of the House of Lords, United Kingdom

Baroness Verma was appointed Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for the



Department of Energy and Climate Change in September 2012. She is a Conservative member of the House of Lords. In 2006 she was raised to the peerage as Baroness Verma of Leicester in the County of Leicestershire. She was Opposition Whip from 2006 to 2010, then Government Whip following the 2010 general election. Prior to becoming Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for DECC, she was Spokesperson for the Cabinet Office, International Development, Women and Equalities and Business Innovation and Skills. Convinced that one can make a difference by

empowering people to help themselves, she speaks about innovation, forward thinking and skill development.



Prof. Viviana Gaballo, Asst. Professor in English Language and Translation, University of Macerata. Italy

Viviana Gaballo is Assistant Professor in English Language and Translation at the University of Macerata, Italy. She has been teaching English since 1992 in several departments and universities in Italy and abroad. A professional translator since 1980, she founded the Veneto section of AITI (Italian Association of Translators and Interpreters), which she chaired in its first six years. Since June 2013, she has been a member of the editorial board of the "International Journal of Human Rights and Constitutional Studies", published by InderScience Publishers, which aims to promote, from a global perspective, academic dialogue on current issues of constitutional law

and the protection of human rights.



Rt. Rev. Riah Abu El-Assal, Emeritus Anglican Bishop of Jerusalem, Israel

Riah Abu El-Assal is the 13th Anglican Bishop of the Diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East. Former Bishop of Jerusalem, he is currently an ITNJ Judicial Commissioner leading its Truth and Reconciliation Commission. Bishop Riah has served in different capacities: an active member of the WCC Commission on Human Rights; Co-Chair of the World council For Religious Leaders; Co-Founder of the Nazareth Democratic Front, Secretary General of the Progressive Movement; visiting Lecturer at St. George's College, Jerusalem; Founder of Bishop Riah Educational Campus in Nazareth; and a member of the Board of Trustees of the Academic Arab College For Education in Haifa, Israel.



Carole Stone CBE, Patron, Universal Peace Federation UK, Founder, The Carole Stone Foundation, United Kingdom

Carole Stone, CBE is a British author and freelance radio and television broadcaster. Stone spent 27 years at the BBC beginning as a newsroom secretary and eventually becoming the producer of Radio 4's flagship discussion programme Any Questions? In 2018, Stone established The Carole Stone Foundation to support her belief that connecting people, exchanging ideas and building friendships around the world is essential to help make a fairer society. Once described as the most connected woman in the UK. She is the Patron of Universal Peace Federation - UK.



Hon. Allal Amraoui, Member of Parliament, Morocco

Hon. Allal Amraoui is a medical doctor and surgeon who participated in the creation of the Faculty of Medicine of Fez and in the launching of the hospital of Fez. He was the Regional Director of Health for 8 years and won the Grand Prize for Health in 2013. A politician, he is a member of the National Council and of the Central Committee of the ISTIQLAL party. He was the 1st deputy mayor of Fez. He is a Member of Parliament, vice-chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Moroccan Parliament and assumes the responsibility of Chairman of the Moroccan delegation to the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe.



Dr. Soumia Guennoun, Professor, Euromed University of Fez, Morocco

Soumia Guennoun obtained her doctorate in environmental law at the University Sidi Mohamed Ibn Abdallah in Fez and has been in charge of academic services at the Euromed University of Fez since September 2014. She worked for 4 years in a development project in Rabat, as a finance officer, under the USAID funded MCH/FP Phase V project. She resumed her studies after ten years of professional experience to get a bachelor's degree in private law and a master's degree in logistics and transport law. She also holds a bachelor's degree in Business.
