
he emissaries to Europe, Rev. Nohi Pak and Dr. Lan-young Moon, visited the Frankfurt community during their first visit to Germany. After greetings by Dieter Schmidt and Fritz Piepenburg, Mrs. Moon told those in attendance that she had always been fond of Europe and she likes reporting to True Mother about the faithful European blessed couples.

On Saturday they both went to the Seminarhaus Neumuehle, Bad Camberg, and joined the leaders' meeting. They explained to the German leadership their mission as special emissaries to Europe and what it means to them.



On Sunday they participated in the church service of the Frankfurt community in a church overflowing with brothers and sisters and a number of guests. There they shared their testimonies about their life in the church in the early days. Mrs. Moon spoke on **the subject "60 years with True Parents".** Originally from North Korea, she recalled joining the Unification Church in 1955. Her testimony was illustrated by a power point show of historic pictures. True Father's vision then seemed farfetched and unrealistic, but has become reality: members from all over the world are now travelling to Korea. Mrs. Moon in her capacity as President of the **Women's Federation was able to contact** top level people such as UN Secretary General Ban-ki Moon and former US President George Bush and his wife. In the afternoon, the couple could do some sightseeing in Frankfurt. Besides the river Main, the Dome and the

historic city center "Roemer", they also had the opportunity to visit the Holy Ground in the Gruneburg Park, which True Father himself established in 1965. Why did they come to Frankfurt first? "Because here the pioneers of Europe, Peter Koch and Paul Werner, started their mission."

On Monday, Rev. Pak and Dr. Moon visited Heidelberg in preparation for the Little Angels, who will also visit Heidelberg for sightseeing during their upcoming tour in which they will perform in Frankfurt. Lunch was served **in the historic student inn, "The Red Ox"** (dating back to the 15th century), where they could register their names in the **huge visitors' book, where many** prominent people have left their mark over the centuries.
