## **UPF Moscow**, Russia: Commemorates International World Interfaith Harmony Week

**Moscow, Russia** -- UPF commemorated International Day of Human Fraternity and World Interfaith Harmony Week with a webinar titled "The Important Role of Cultural Heritage and Strengthening Interreligious Dialogue."

The event on February 7, 2022, also acknowledged that 2022 is the Year of the Cultural Heritage of the Peoples of Russia, as announced by a decree signed by the president.



The webinar was intended to show, on the one hand, the great diversity of nationalities that live in Russia and, on the other hand, the spiritual principles that enable people of different nationalities and religions to live together.

The 12 speakers represented traditional religions of Russia and the republics of the Russian Federation.

Cultural performances by two folk ensembles emphasized the beauty and diversity of the peoples living in Russia.
