'Hope of the World Springs from the Unity of Peace and Love' the Multicultural Peace Festival in Korea Welcomes 10,000 Attendees

Sun Moon University (President Sun-Jo Hwang) and the 2014 Multicultural Peace Festival Organization Committee (Director Kyeung-Seuk Lu) held the "Multicultural Peace Festival in Korea 2014" on the 1st. About 10,000 people from Japan, the Philippines, Thailand and about 80 other nations, gathered together for the event.

The Multicultural Peace Festival began when people who resonated with Rev. Sun Myung Moon and Dr.

Hak Ja Han Moon's teachings of peace and the realization of true love came together to realize love and service in society.



The festival was hosted by the Korea Multicultural Peace Federation, Sun Moon University and the Multicultural General Welfare Center. A commemorative ceremony kicked off the event, followed by a series of special multicultural performances and the "One Garden Multicultural Festival."



Around 166 service organizations from all over the country participated in the "Global Village One Family Parade," which spanned a distance of 1.8 km between Asan City Hall and Onyang Oncheon Station. Multicultural special performances were then given by multicultural children, youth, university students and women's groups, followed by the national multicultural women's arm wrestling contest, a multicultural soccer tournament and an interreligious friendship soccer tournament. About 30 experiential booths livened up the festival as well, including world cultural experience booths, international food stalls, flea markets and children's rides.

After preliminary performances by the Aju Traditional Troupe and the Sun Moon University Cheering

Team, there was a formal citizens' ceremony, followed by a commemorative video viewing and a welcoming speech by Sun Moon University President Sun-Jo Hwang.

At the launching ceremony of the True Love Peace Service Federation, representatives Hyo-Jun Ryu and Ah-Young Choi recited an oath, pledging to "realize the vision of all of humankind as one family, to grow as world citizens and to create a model multicultural society." The representatives then presented the Federation co-representatives, Yeon-Ah Moon and Kyeung-Seuk Lu, with the oath and the Federation flag.



During the "Global Village One Family Parade," about 1,000 people, including multicultural families, foreign residents of Korea, foreign exchange students and dignitaries marched from Onyang Oncheon Station to Asan City Hall. The parade, which spanned about 210 meters long, was divided into three groups. The parade made its way to downtown Asan under the banners of "Korea welcoming the citizens of the world," "couples creating happiness," "the future of multicultural children" and "Korea as one family." At the parade finale, *Gangkang Suwollae* and other performances were presented at Asan City Hall, followed by three cheers of Mansei, celebrating peace.
